

- Provisional allocations for recurrent grants totalling £6,300 million to higher education institutions (HEIs) were released in March 2009 by HEFCE
- 41 HEIs in London¹, comprising 32% of 130 HEIs in England, are to receive £1, 500 million, or 24%, of £6, 300 million in recurrent grants for 2009/10²
- London's HEIs are to receive 22% of £4, 600 million allocated for teaching and 30% of £1, 600 million allocated for research
- £130 million has been provided under widening participation and London HEIs are to receive 9% of this while HEIs in the North West will receive 22%
- A Top 20 list for total recurrent grant allocation contains four research-intensive HEIs from London
- Top 20 lists for total teaching grant and total research funding feature three and four HEIs from London, respectively
- Within London, the four research-intensive HEIs will receive 37% of teaching grants and 62% of research grants
- Comparing research funding grants in 2008/09³ with 2009/10 for London;
 - the largest percent increases are for several small- and medium-sized HEIs
 - 17 HEIs will have research funding raised between £125, 000 to £7 million
 - increases in research grants will be less than the UK inflation rate (considered to be 2%) for two HEIs
 - 14 HEIs will face reductions in research funding of between £42, 000 to £5 million

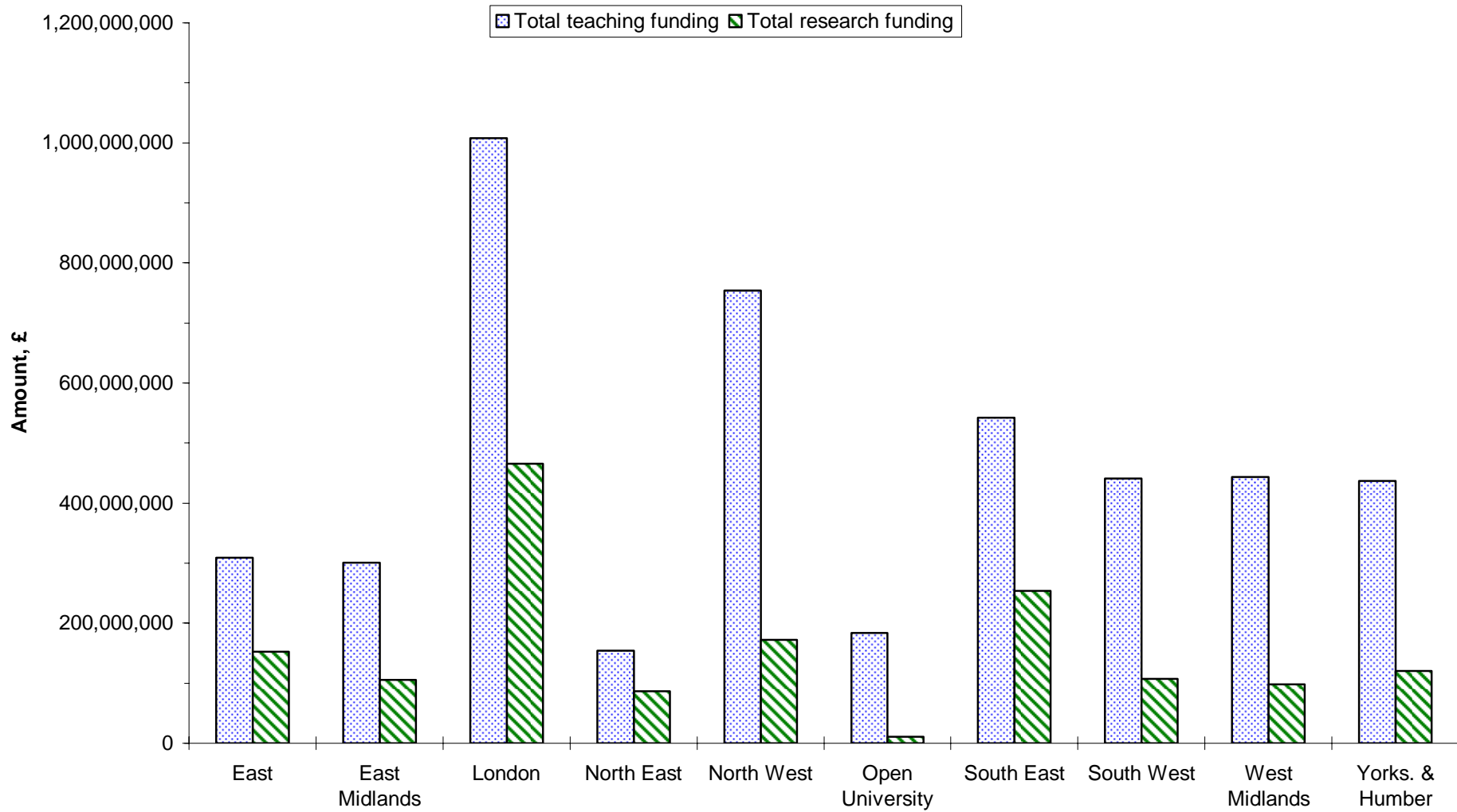

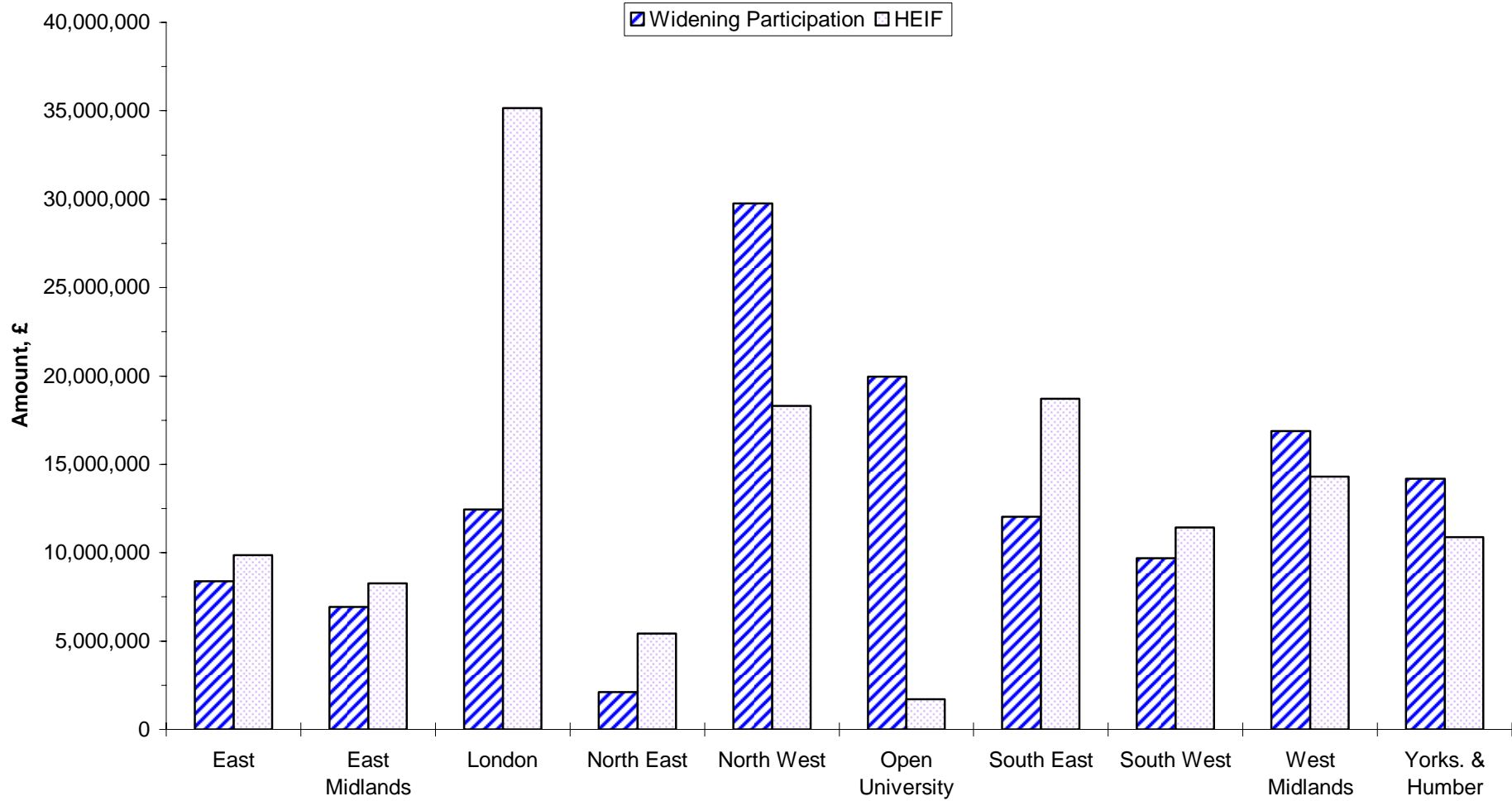

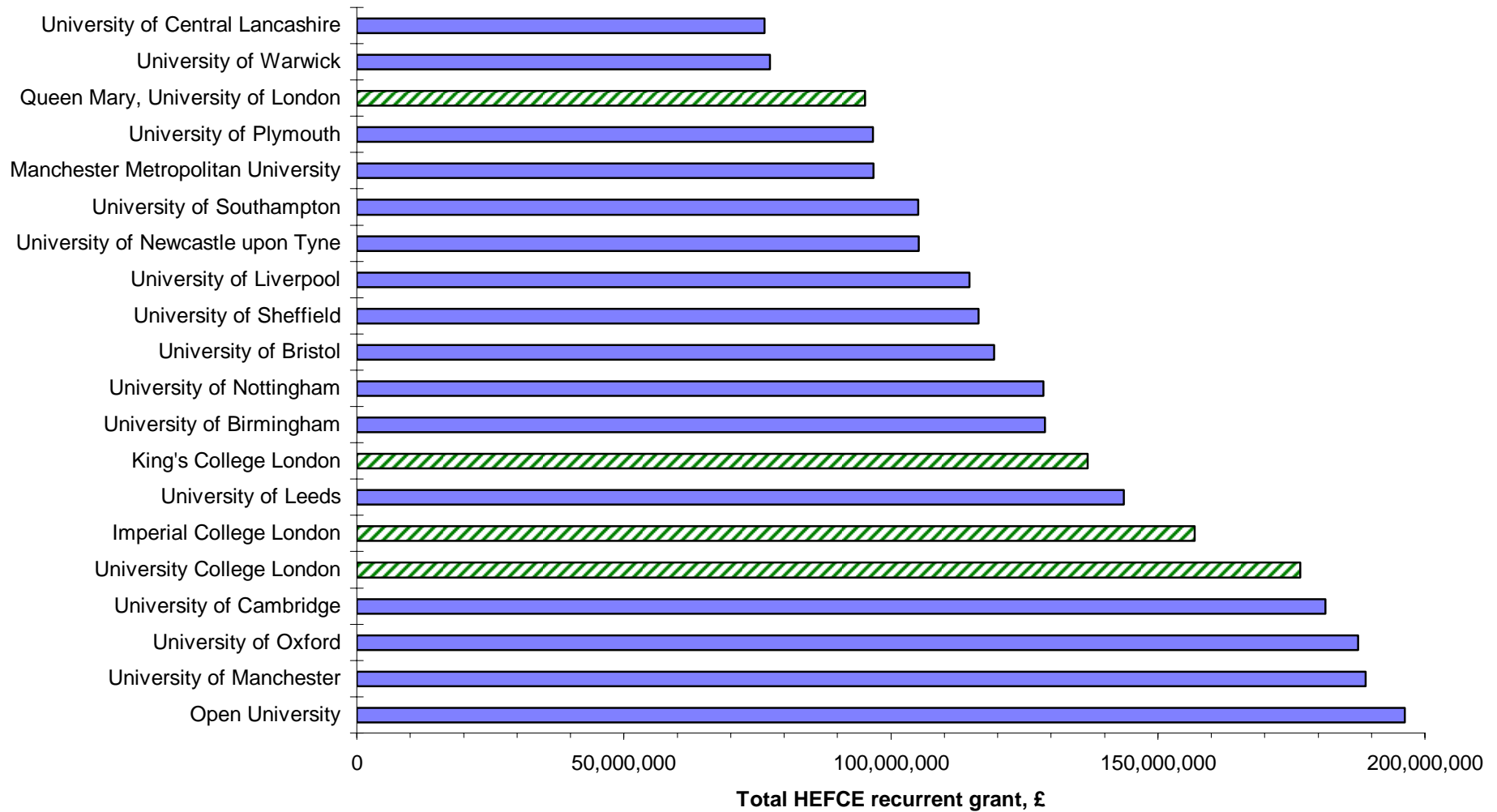
Teaching and Research funding by Region, 2009/10



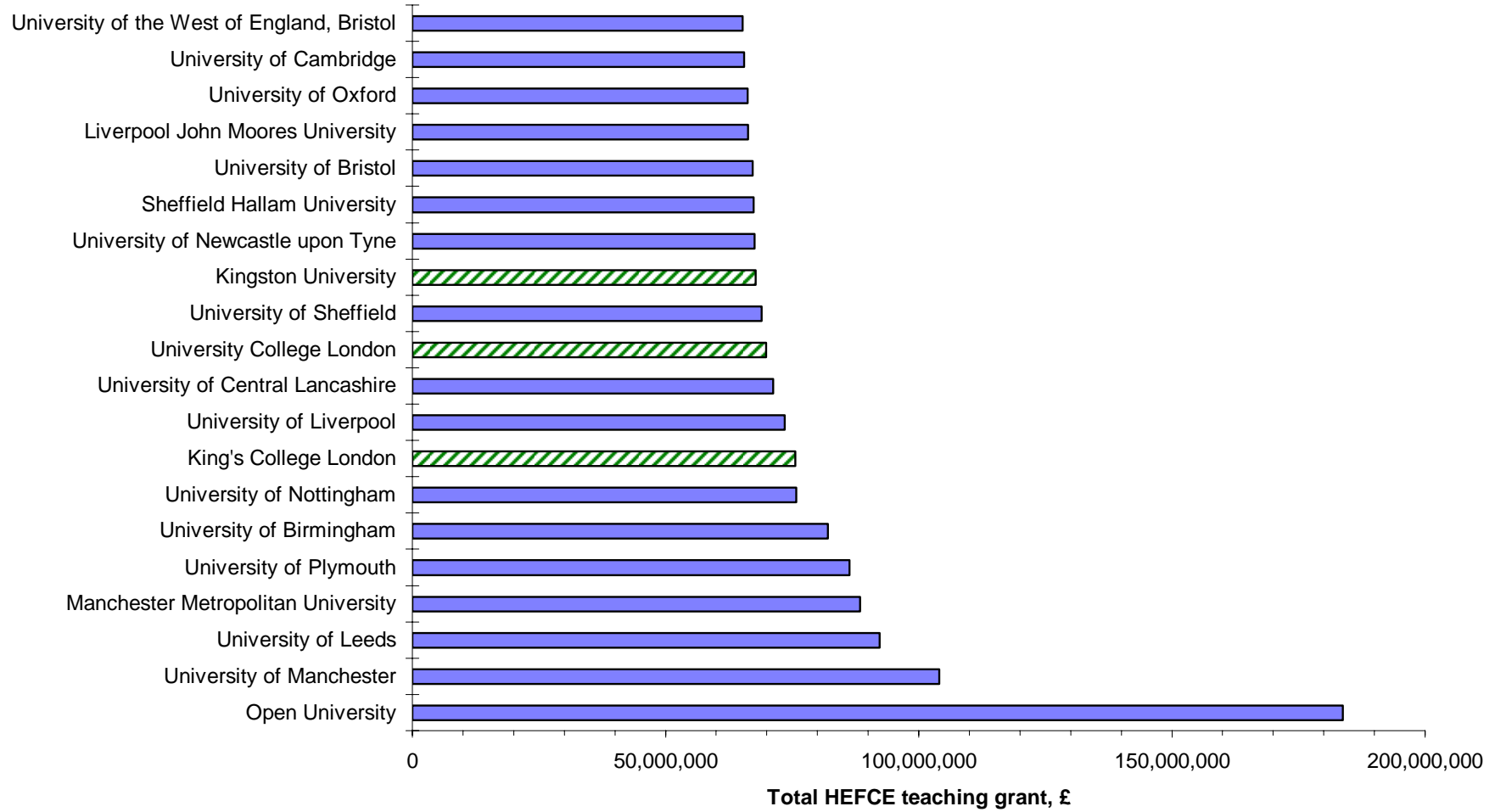
Widening Participation and HEIF grants by Region, 2009/10
Total for WP = £132,371,042; Total for HEIF = £134,075,012



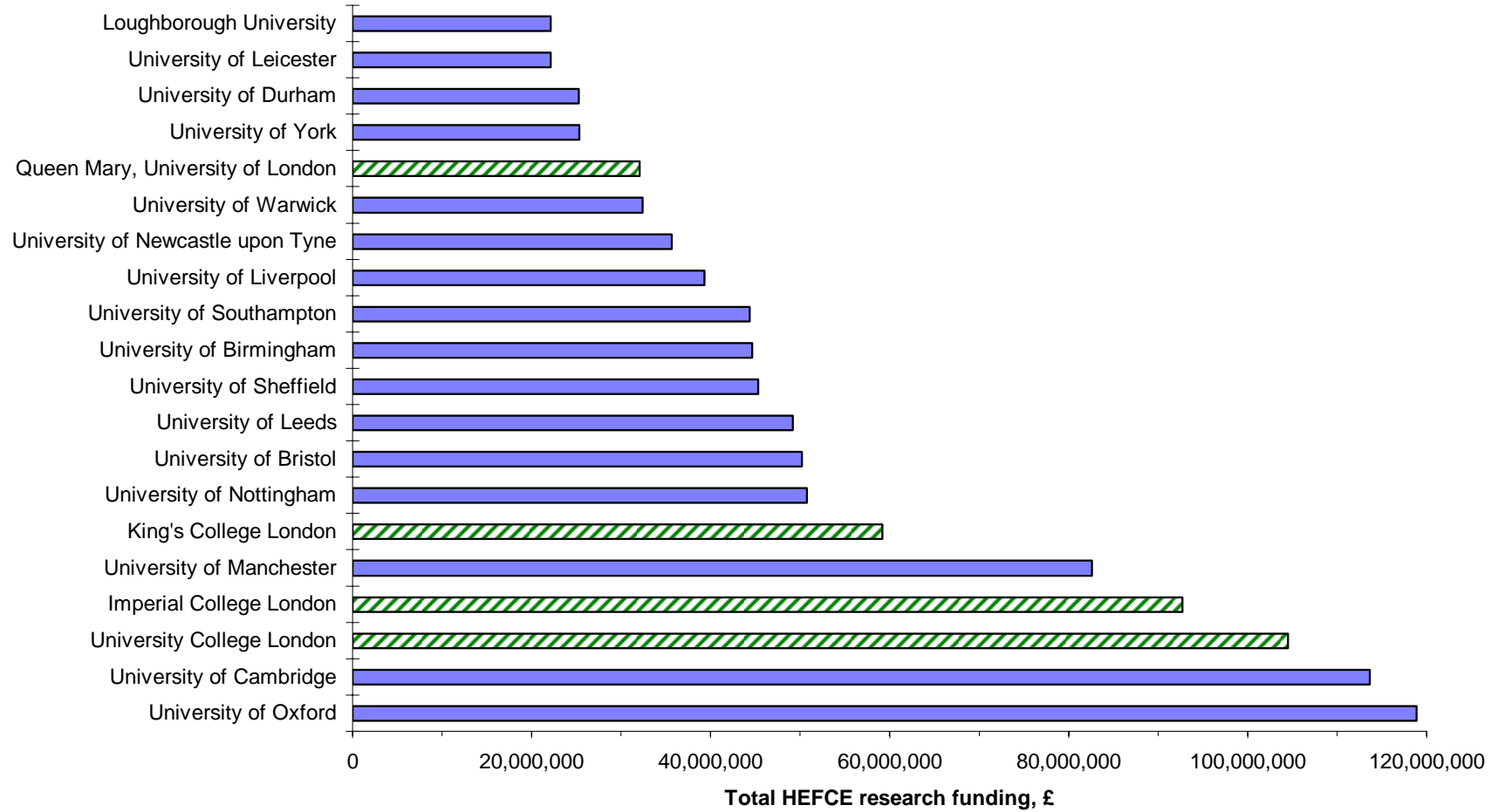
Top 20 for total recurrent grant, 2009/10



Top 20 for total teaching grant, 2009/10

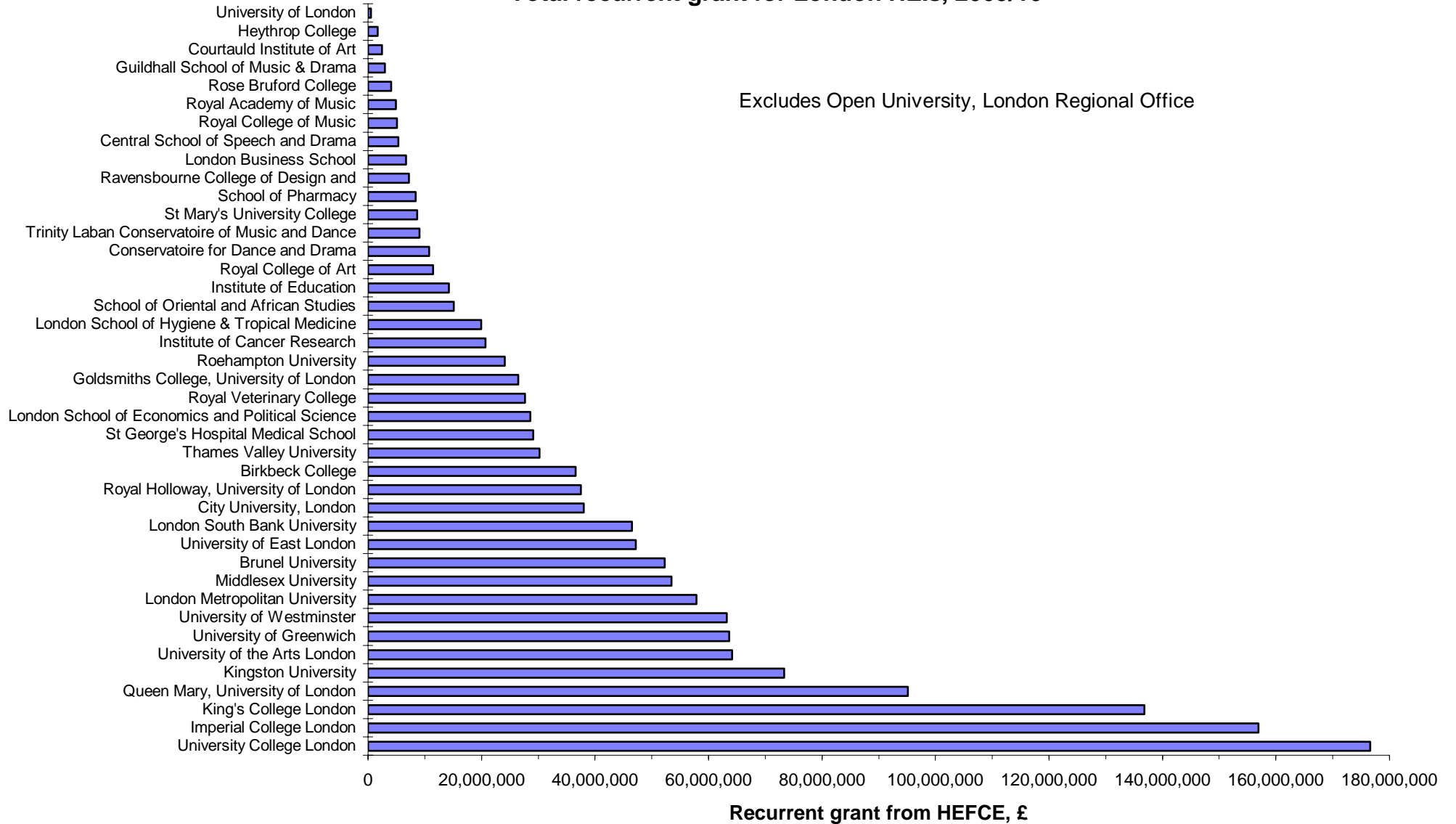


Top 20 for total research funding, 2009/10

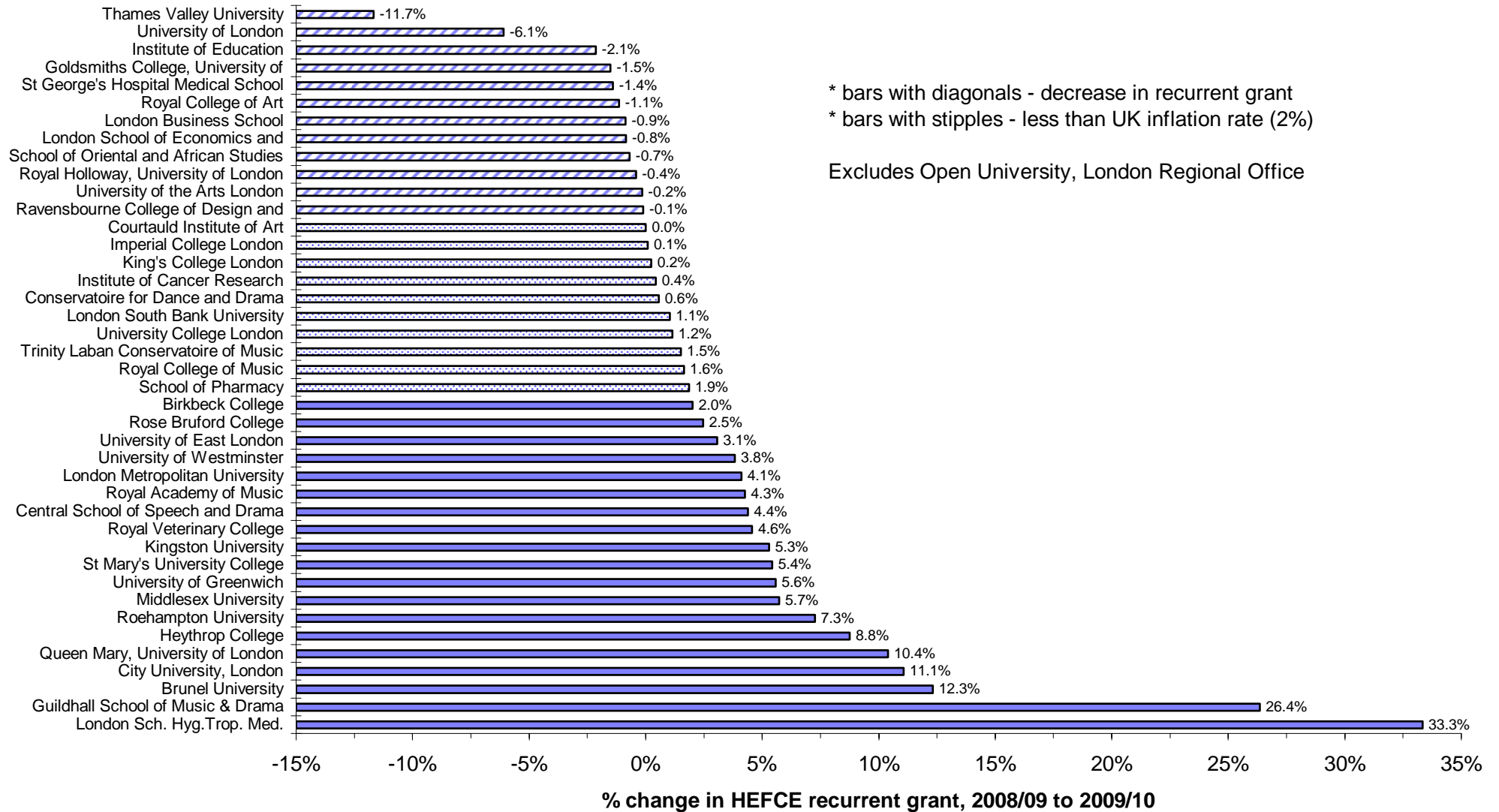


Total recurrent grant for London HEIs, 2009/10

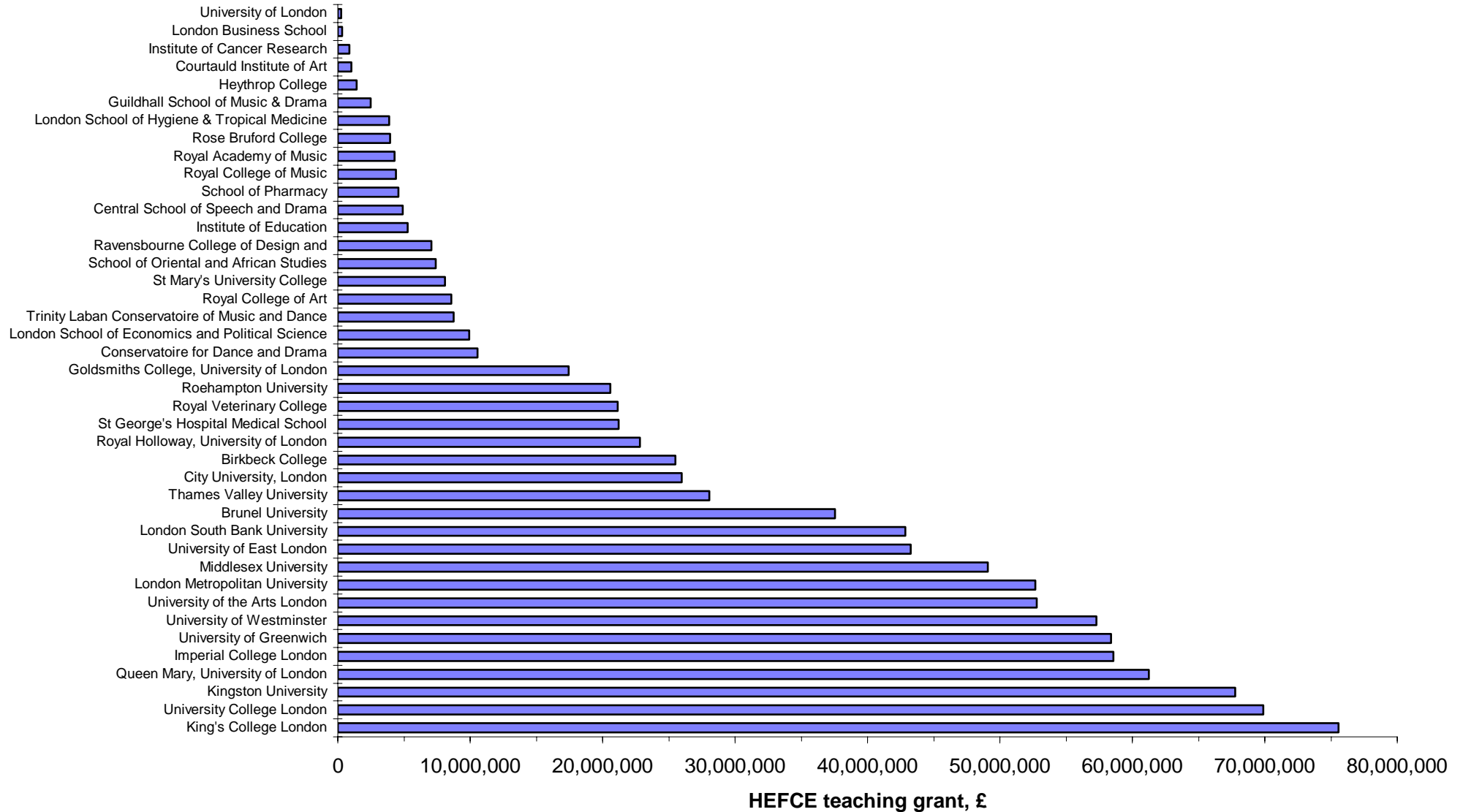

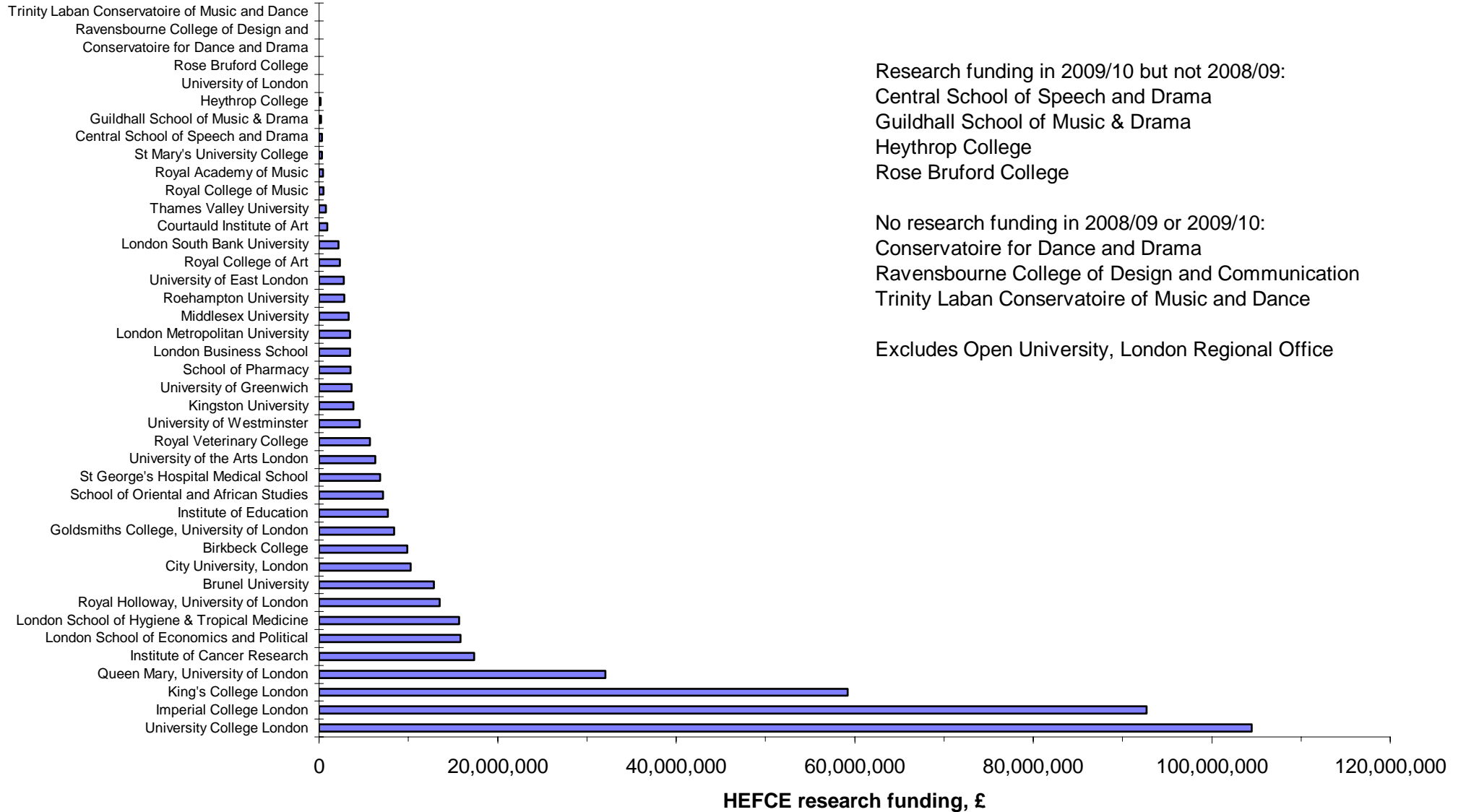
Percent change in total recurrent grant for London HEIs



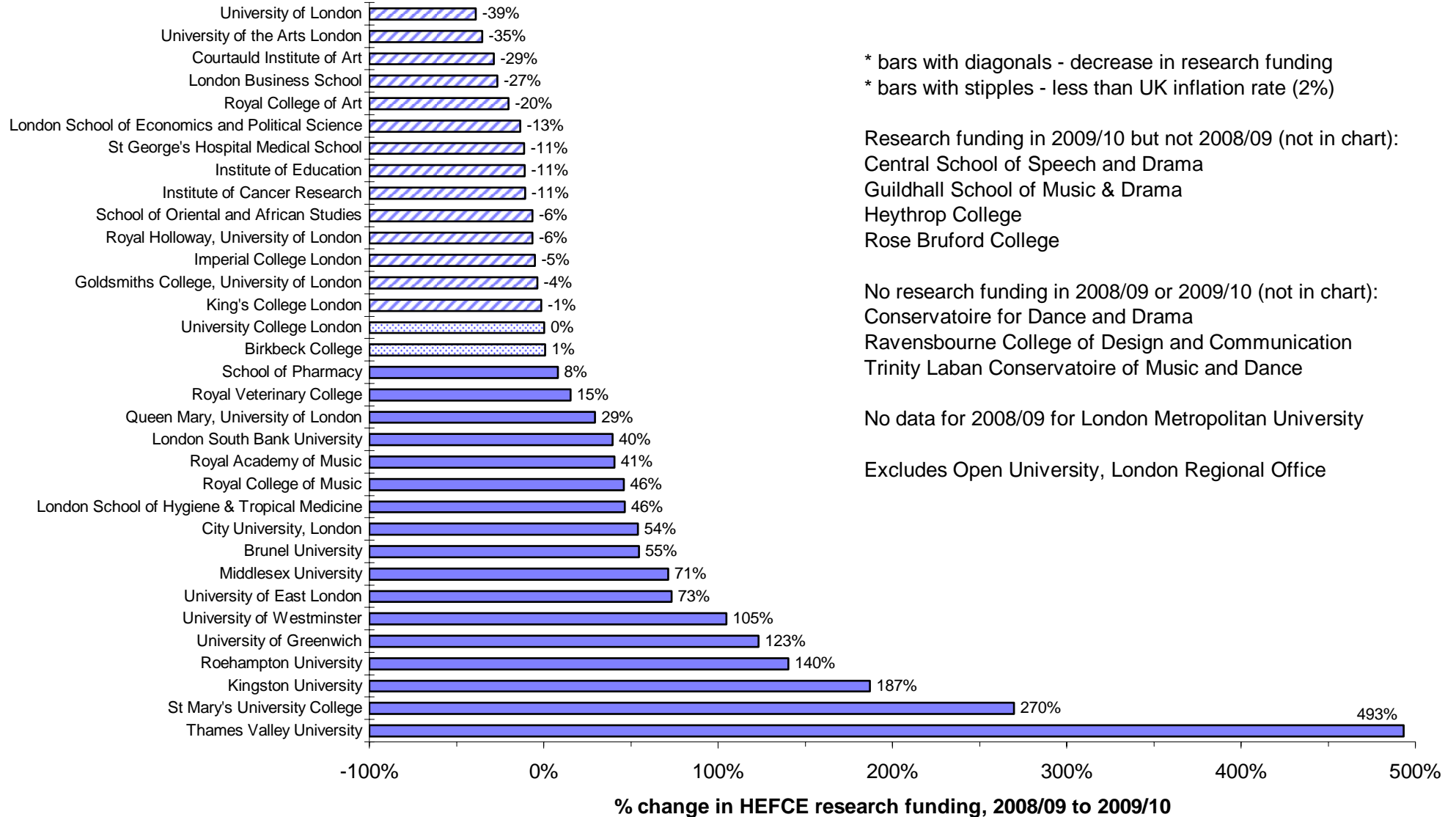
Total teaching grant for London HEIs, 2009/10
