**Arts and Humanities Research Council: responsive and strategic mode grant awards 2010/11**

1. Awards made by AHRC in 2010/11 for responsive and strategic mode grants were summed by UK research organisations (ROs).
2. Of 140 ROs applying for grants, 39 were based in London and 21 of these received one or more grants.

3. The success rate for London at 40% was more than double the success rates in either 2008/09 or 2009/10. This was in line with a general rise in grants receiving funding from 17% in 2009/10 to 39% for the current year.
4. ROs in London obtained £8.3 million which was equivalent to 23% of the total of £36.1 million awarded by AHRC during this time.
5. Of the 53 responsive mode grants awarded to London ROs, UCL obtained 14, while Royal Holloway obtained five and King's College London and the School for Oriental and African Studies had four each.
6. Queen Mary and King's College London received three strategic mode grants each from the 14 awarded to London ROs.
