2. Of 100 research organisations (RO) applying for responsive mode and initiative grants, 22% were in London.

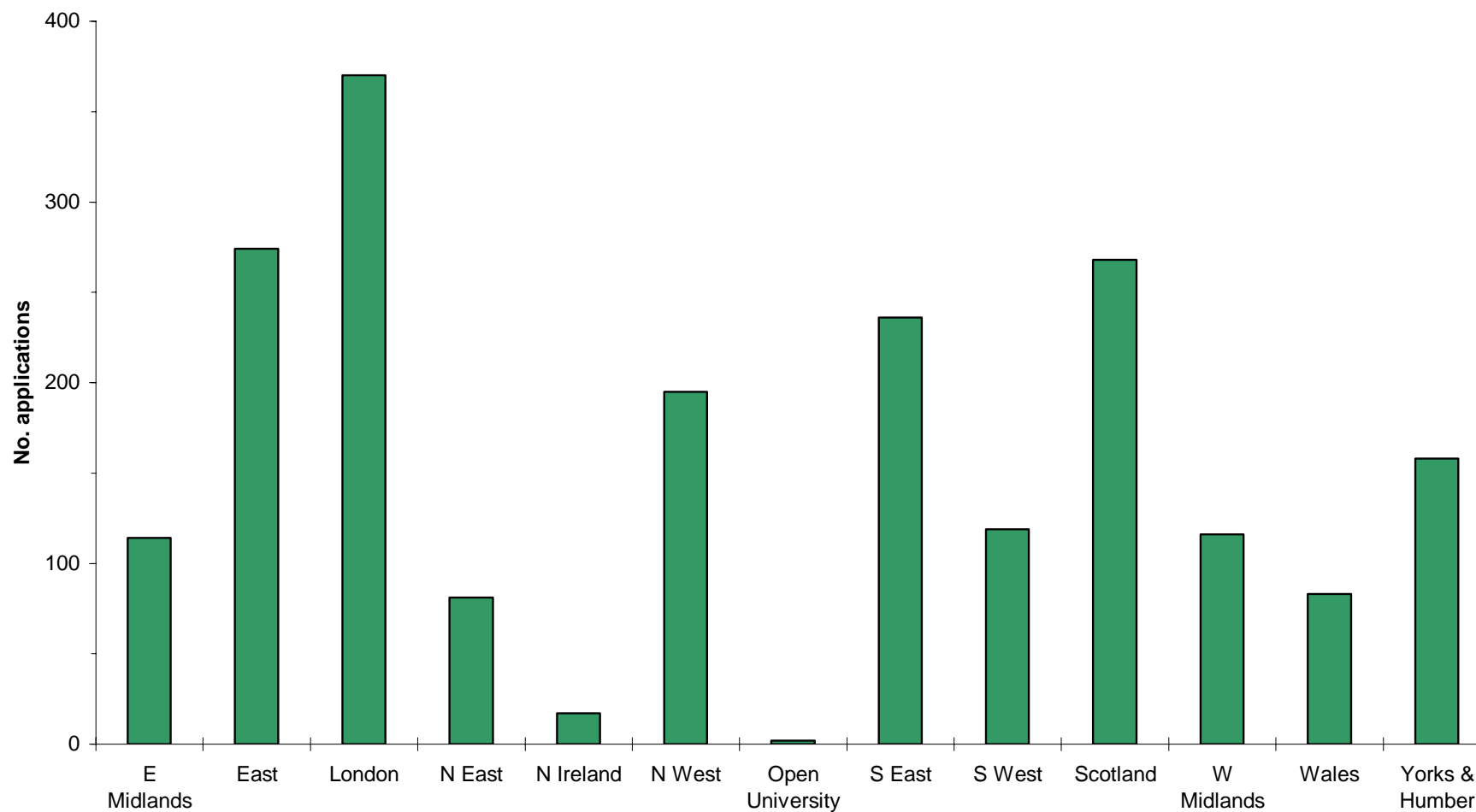
3. Of the 22 ROs in London, 17 (=77%) were higher education institutions while the remainder consisted of museums, professional societies and BBSRC centres.

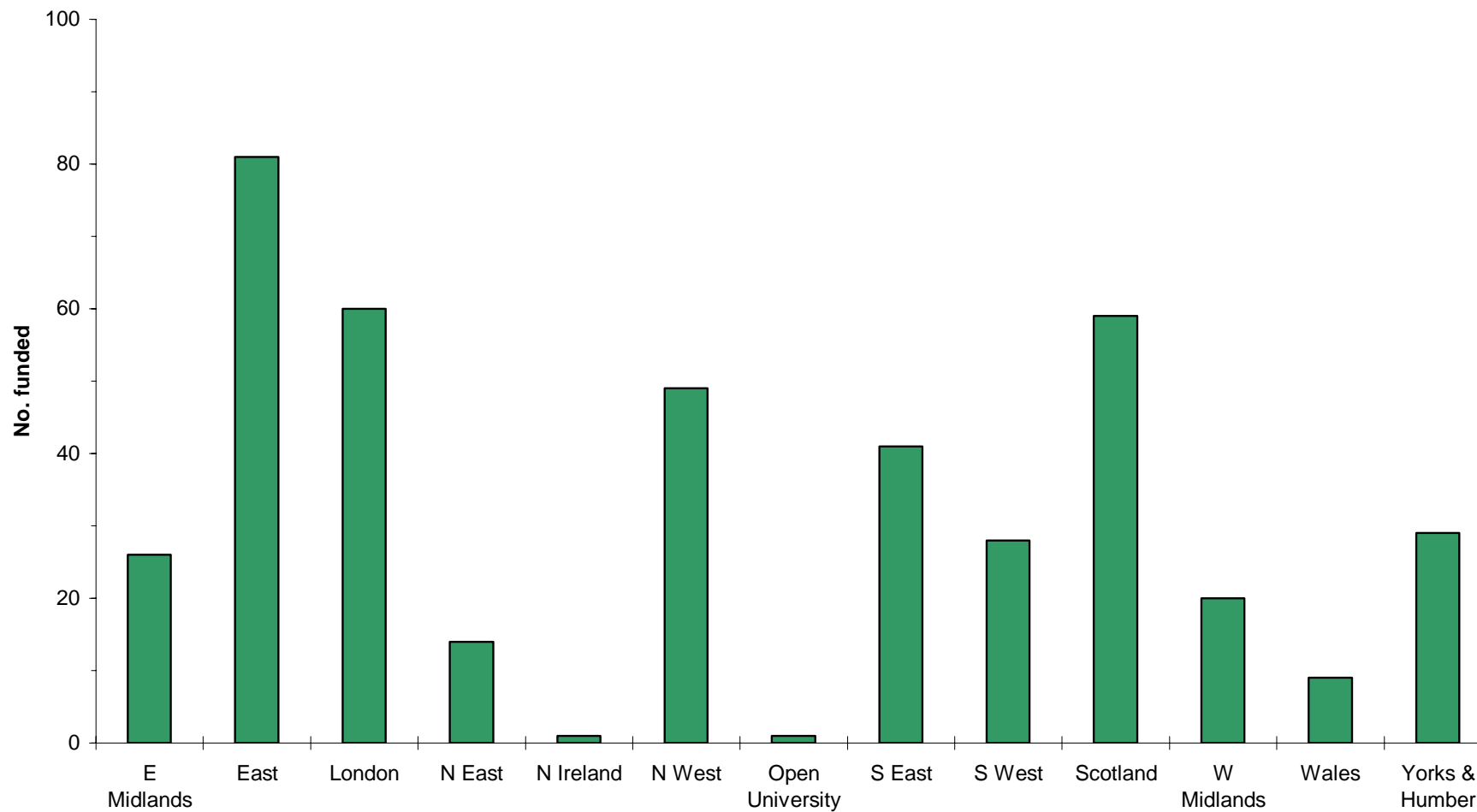
4. The percent of successful applications for London was 16% (60 awards from 370 applications) while ROs in the East had the highest percentage of successful applications (30% from 274 applications).

5. The total amount of grants to London was second behind the East at £30 million and ROs in London obtained 15% of the total of £206 million awarded by BBSRC in 2008/09.
6. Of the 60 grants awarded to London, 25 (=42%) were to Imperial College, 13 (=22%) to University College London and four each to Queen Mary, King's College London and the Royal Veterinary College.

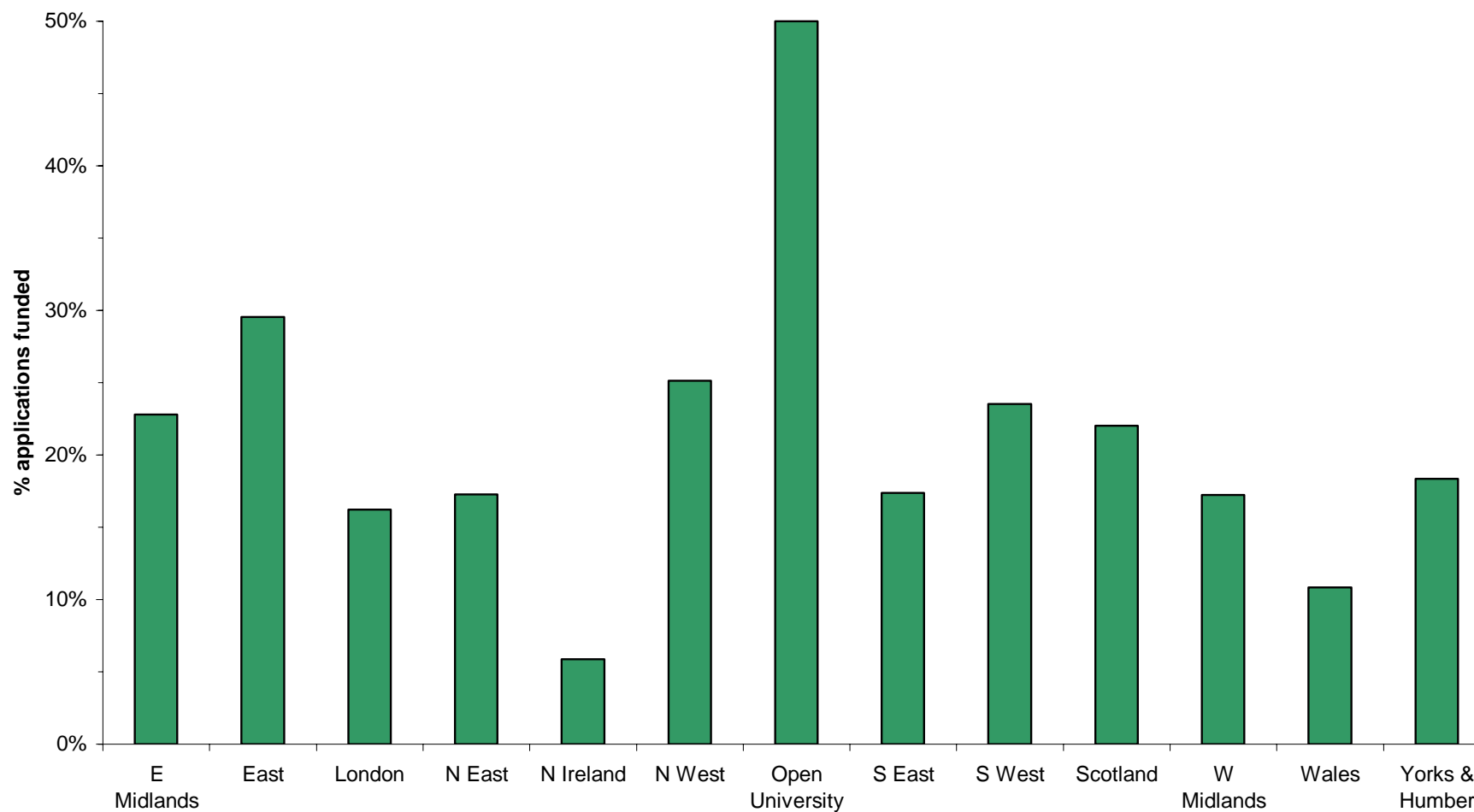
BBSRC Responsive mode and Initiatives: applications by Region, 2008/09
