

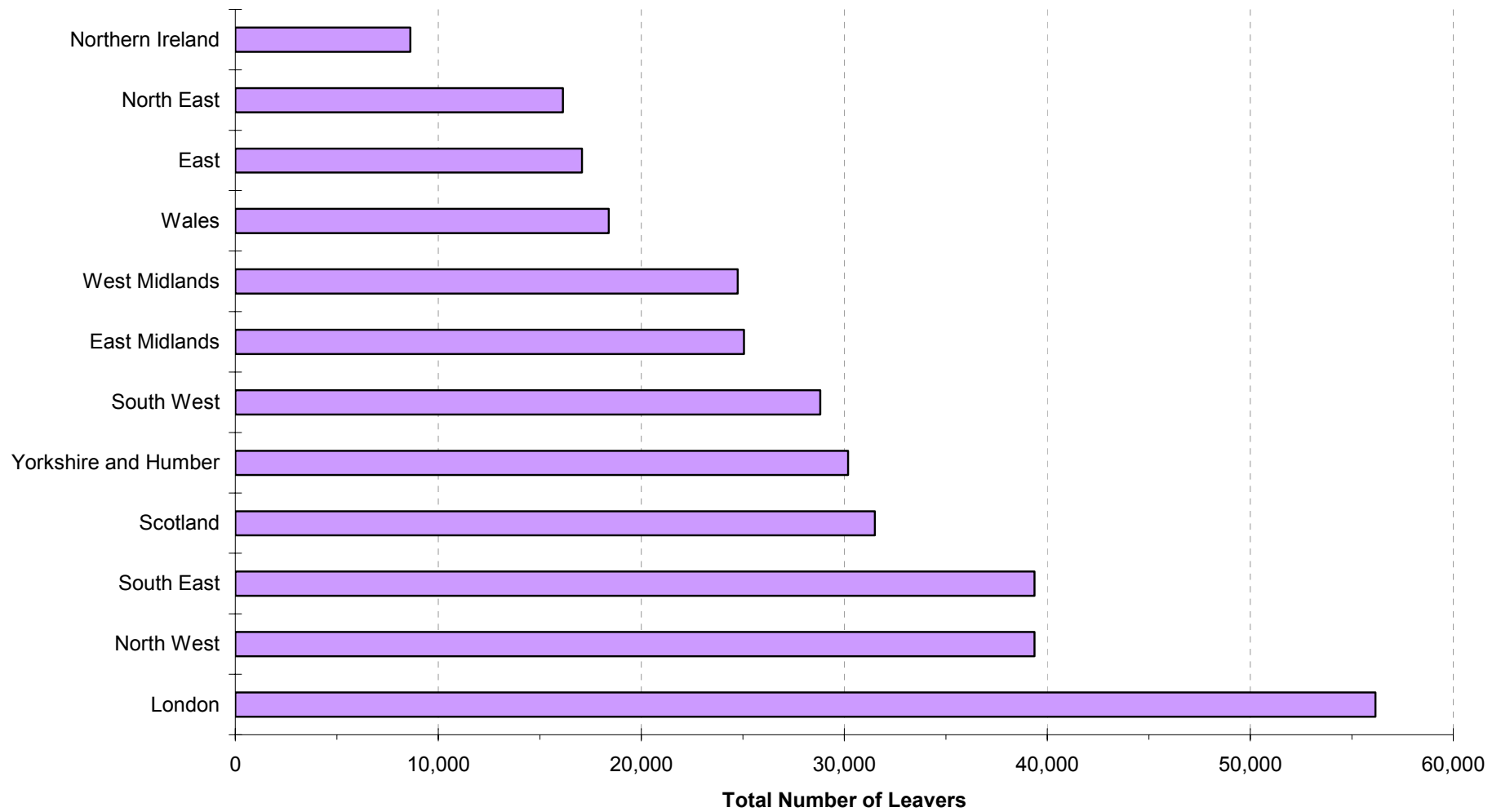
FACT SHEET: DESTINATIONS OF LEAVERS FROM HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS, 2006/07

- Data is collected on UK and other EU graduates approximately six months after completing a course of study at a higher education (HE) institution
- 332,110 students graduated during 2006/07 from 169 HE institutions in the UK which included 42 HE institutions in London and 26 outside of England
- 17% of all UK leavers were from London and the next highest region was the North West with 12% of all UK leavers
- Of 56,160 HE students who completed studies in London, the majority (75%) had registered as full-time students
- 66% of leavers in London found full-time paid work within six months, 12% registered for further studies and 5% were assumed to be unemployed
- These compare with UK averages of 58% in full-time work, 14% in further studies and 5% assumed unemployed
- 70% of leavers who studied in London subsequently found employment in London, while 20% were employed in the East or South East
- Part-time students were more likely to combine work and study if taking further qualifications compared with full-time students

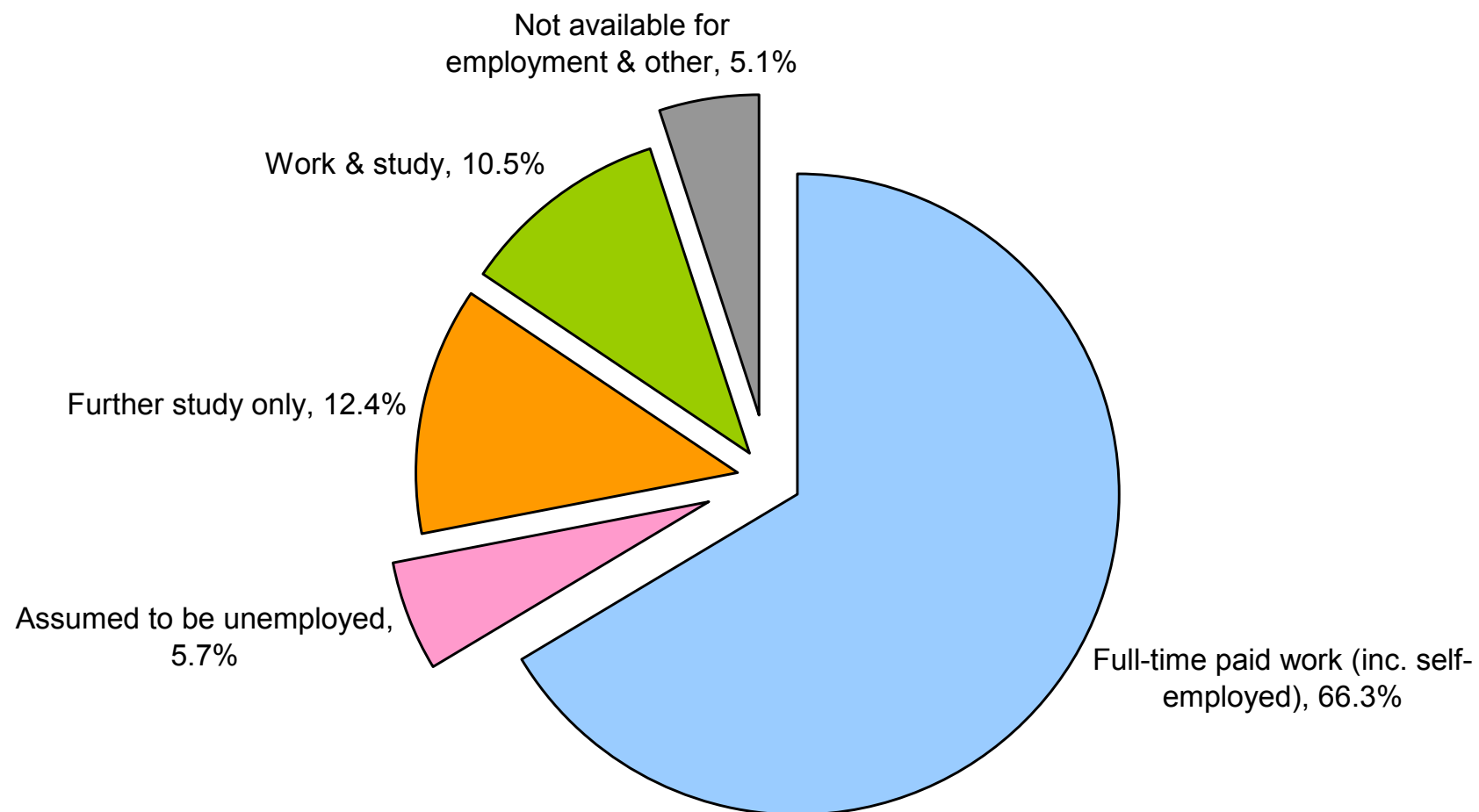

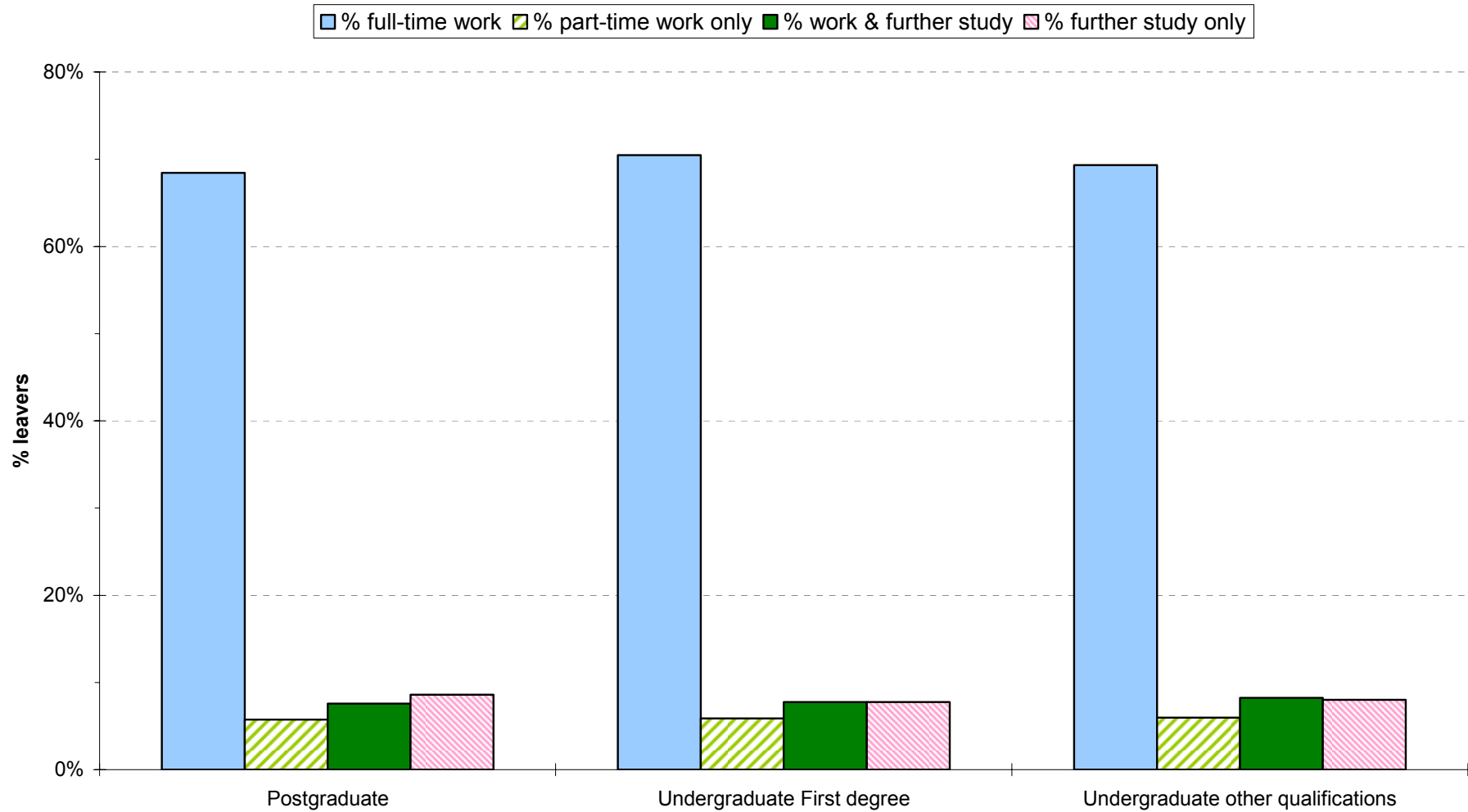
Leavers from Higher Education by UK Region, 2006/07
