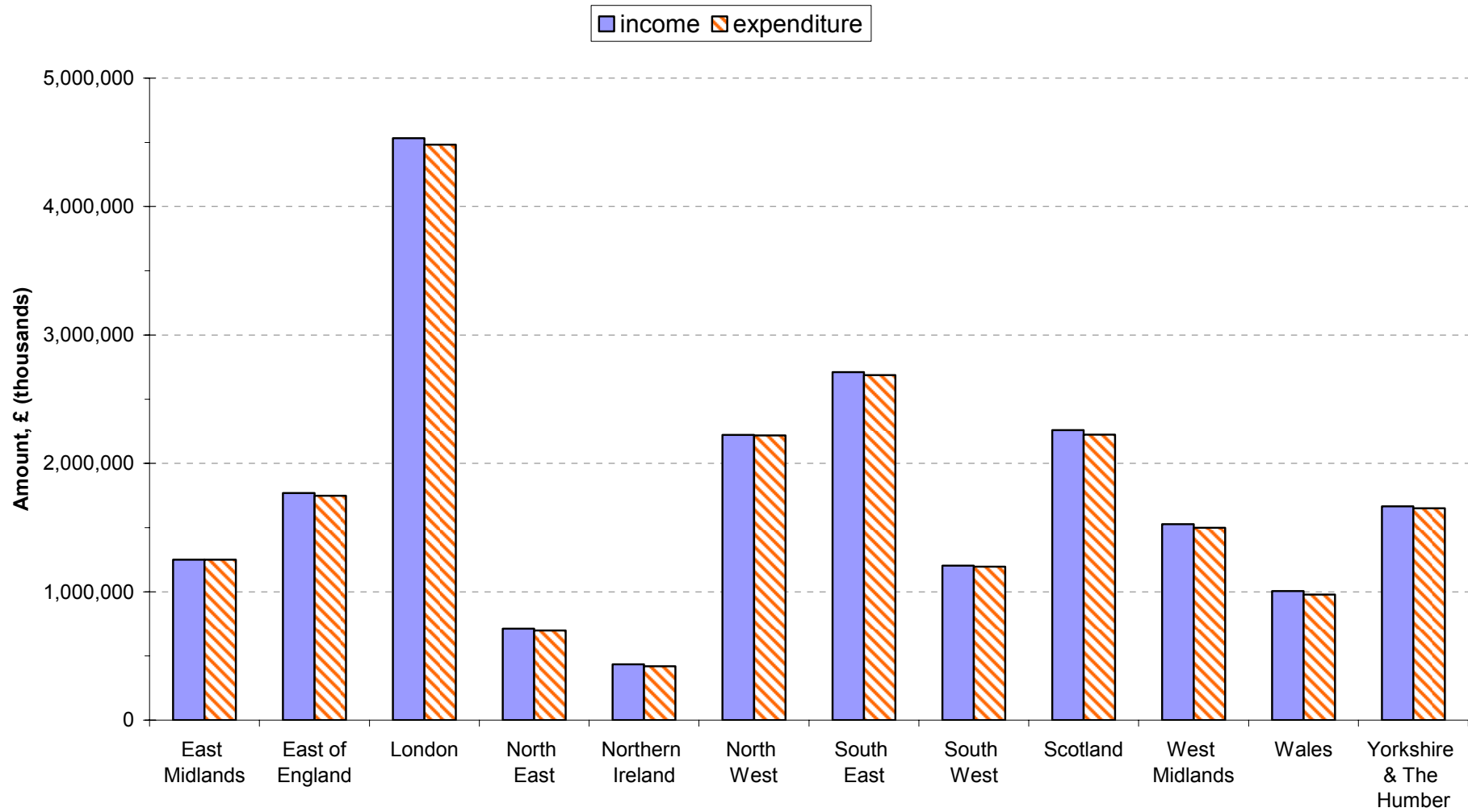


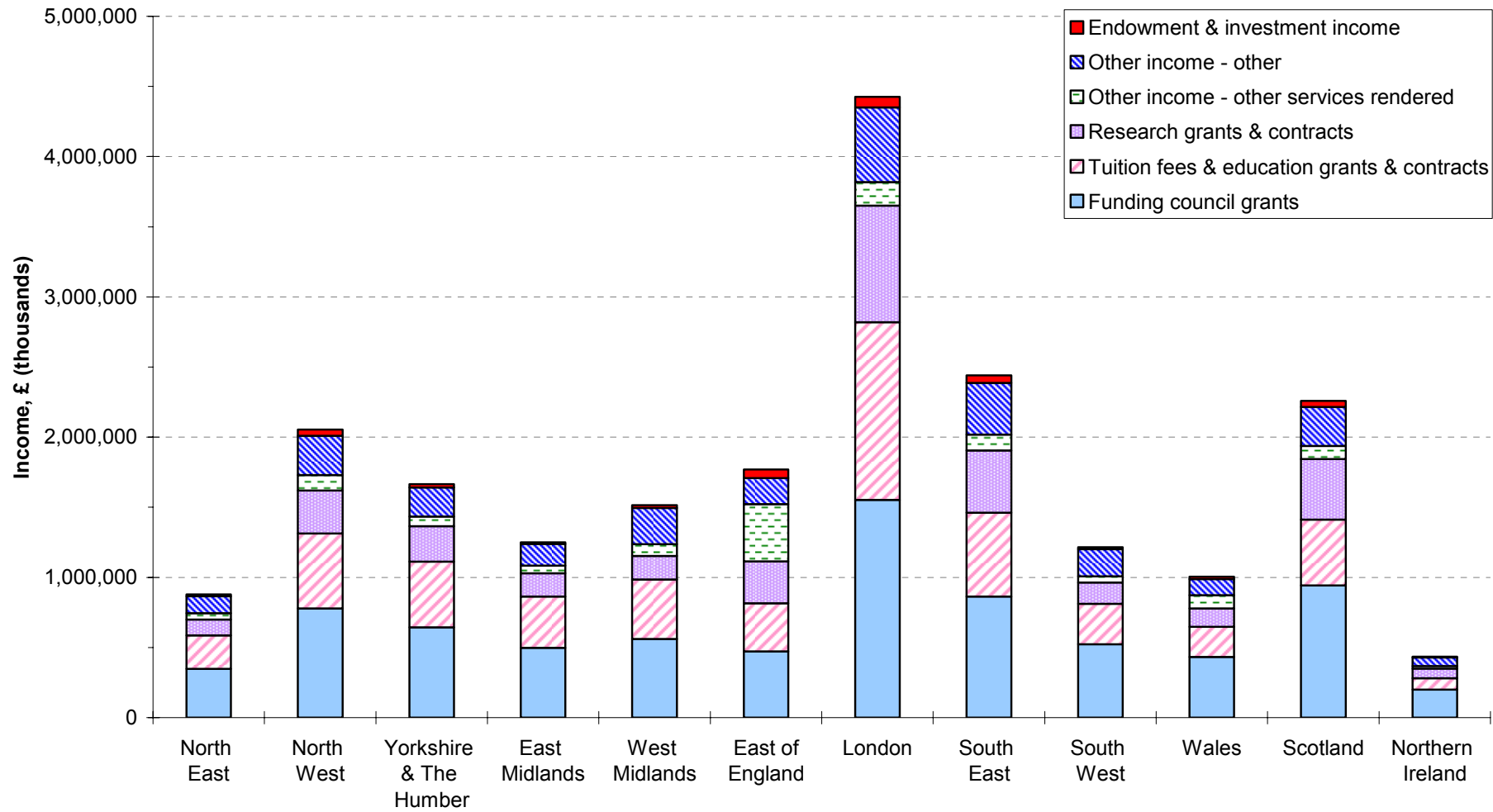
- London universities and colleges obtain £4.5 billion, or 21%, from the total of £21.3 billion received by all UK higher education institutions (HEIs)
- Major income sources for London HEIs are HEFCE (35% of £4.5 billion), tuition fees (29%) and research grants (19%)
- Of £1.2 billion received as tuition fees, 30% is from UK and other EU full-time undergraduates while 41% is from non-EU domiciled students
- Of £830 million won as research grants, 32% is from UK charities, 28% through DIUS (Research Councils) and 14% from UK public sector bodies, while UK commercial organisations provide 8% and EU sources 7% of all research grants
- Expenditure by London HEIs is largely in Medicine, Dentistry and Healthcare (30% of £1.7 billion) while 2% of all academic expenditure is for Mathematics and IT

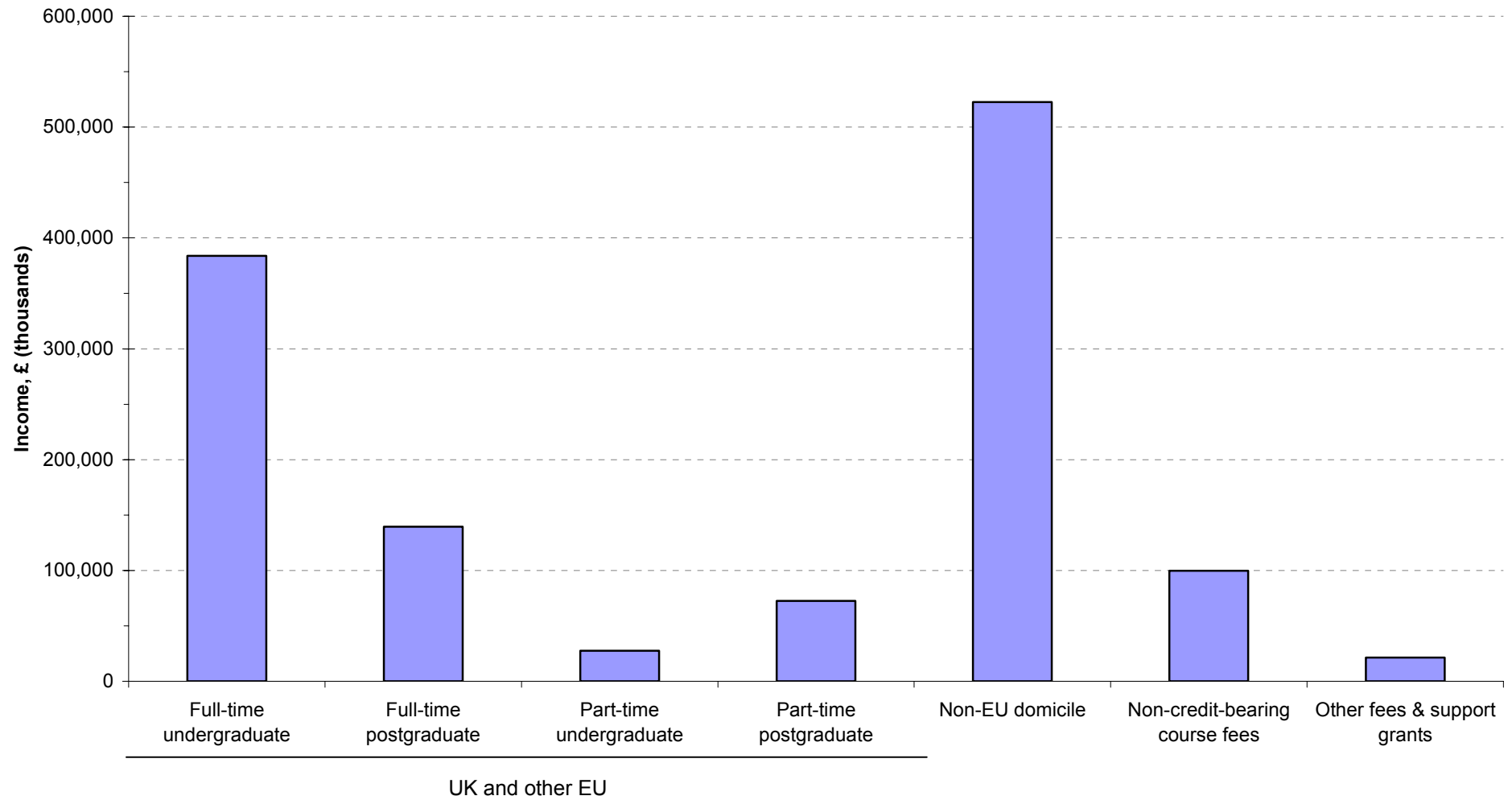
Income/Expenditure by Region, 2006/07



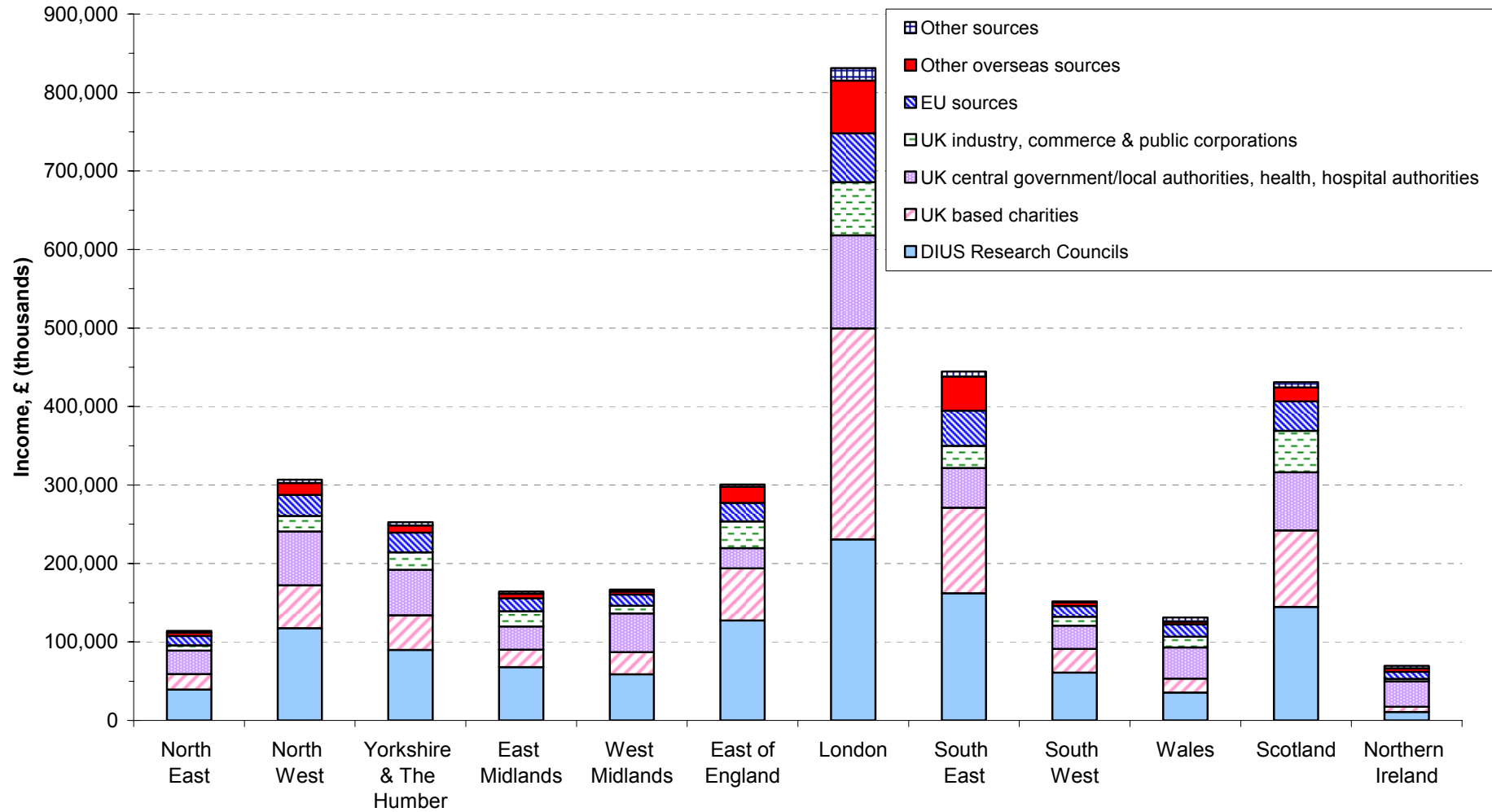
Income sources for HEIs by Region, 2006/07
