### RESOURCES OF HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS 2007/08: INCOME DATA FOR LONDON REGION



- The total income of the higher education (HE) sector in the UK in the financial year to July 2008 was £23.4 billion, and all HE institutions in London shared £5 billion, or 21%, of this income
- Income for London HE institutions was largely from HEFCE grants (34%) and tuition fees (29%), followed by research grants (19%) and income from other sources such as investments and services rendered (18%)
- London HE institutions obtained £900 million as research income, dominated by grants and contracts from UK sources such as charities, central and local government and from healthcare (52%), followed by Research Council funding (30%), EU awards (8%) and other sources (10%)

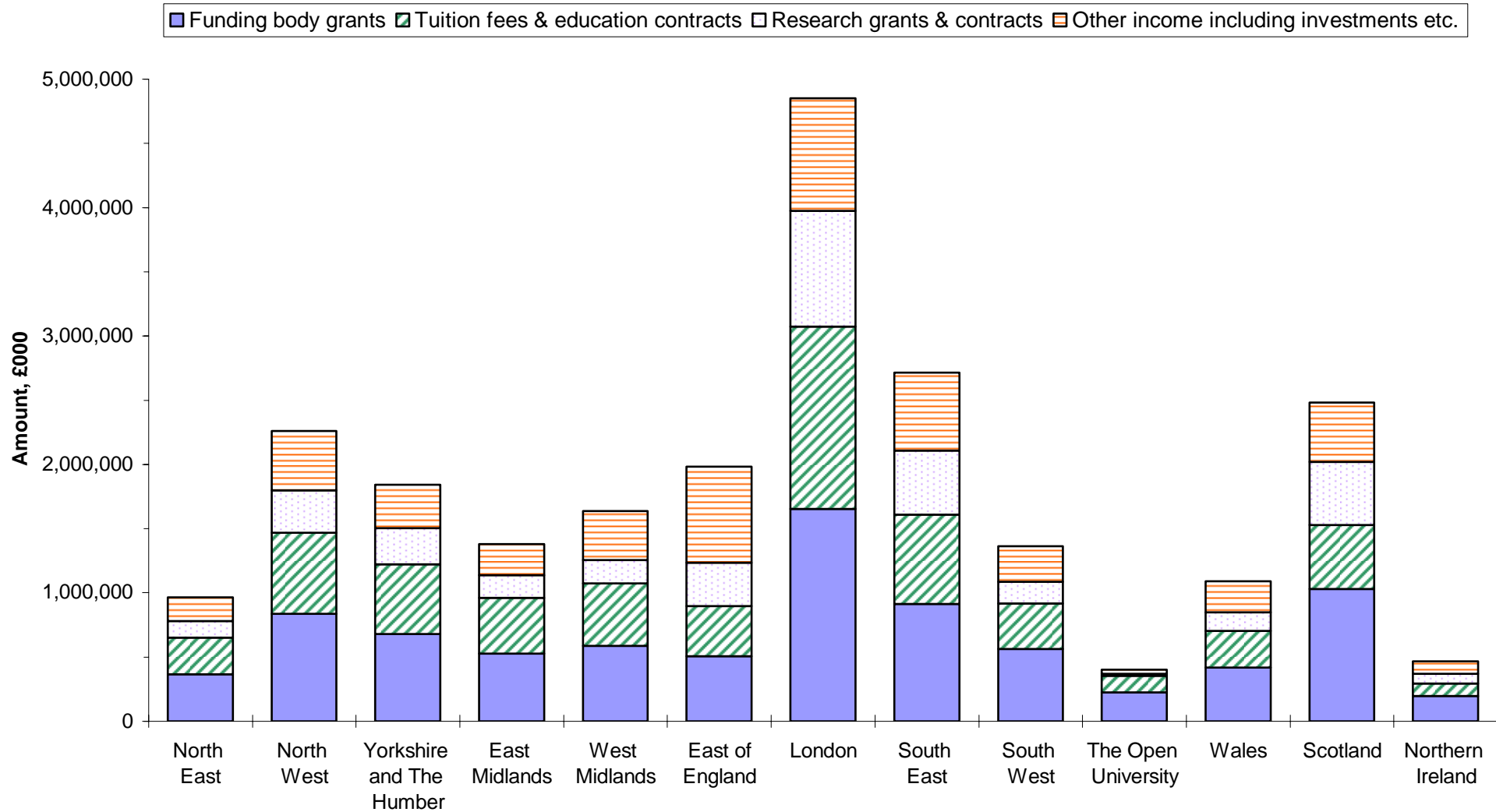
