

### STUDENTS IN HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS 2007/08 – LONDON REGION

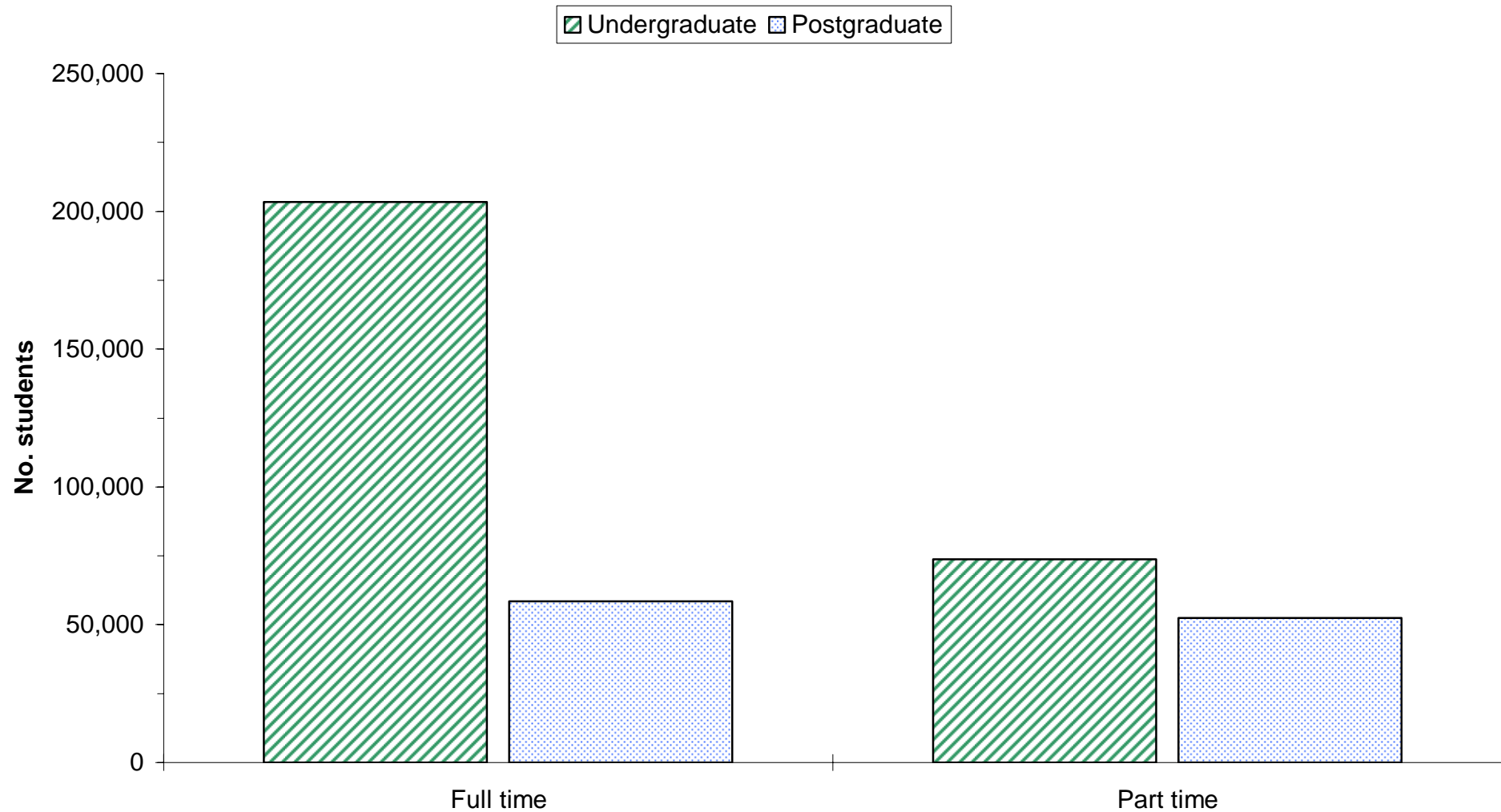
- A total of 404,000 students were registered at Higher Education (HE) institutions in London during 2007/08, an increase from the previous academic year by 10,000 students
- Approximately 16,000 students, or 4% of all students, attended further education courses funded indirectly by a London HE institution (HEI)
- The 388,000 HE students in London made up 17% of the total of 2.3 million HE students in the UK
- Over 277,000 HE students, or 71%, were registered for undergraduate degrees while 111,000, or 29%, were studying at postgraduate level
- 41% of UK students in London were from a black or minority ethnic group, compared with 12% of students at HEIs in the rest of the UK
- 73% of undergraduates and 53% of postgraduates were studying full-time
- 58% of all students in London were female which was a 2% increase from 2006/07
- 17,000 students were registered for initial teacher training (ITT) qualifications with 51% at undergraduate level
- 93,000 overseas students were registered in London, accounting for 23% of the total London student population and 25% of all international students in the UK were studying in London
- Almost 87,000 UK students living in London remained in the capital for full-time undergraduate studies, comprising 43% of the full-time undergraduate population; 49,000 students came to London and 63,000 students left London to study elsewhere in the UK
- Business and administrative studies and subjects allied to healthcare were the two most popular subjects with 16% and 12% of all HE students, respectively
- 58,800 HE students were registered at a London HEI or partner organisation for studies based outside of the UK, making up 43% of all 197,000 “offshore students” studying directly or indirectly with UK HEIs; about 65% of London’s “offshore students” were on distance learning or similar courses
- Of 117,000 HE awards, 43% were for first degrees and 40% at postgraduate level

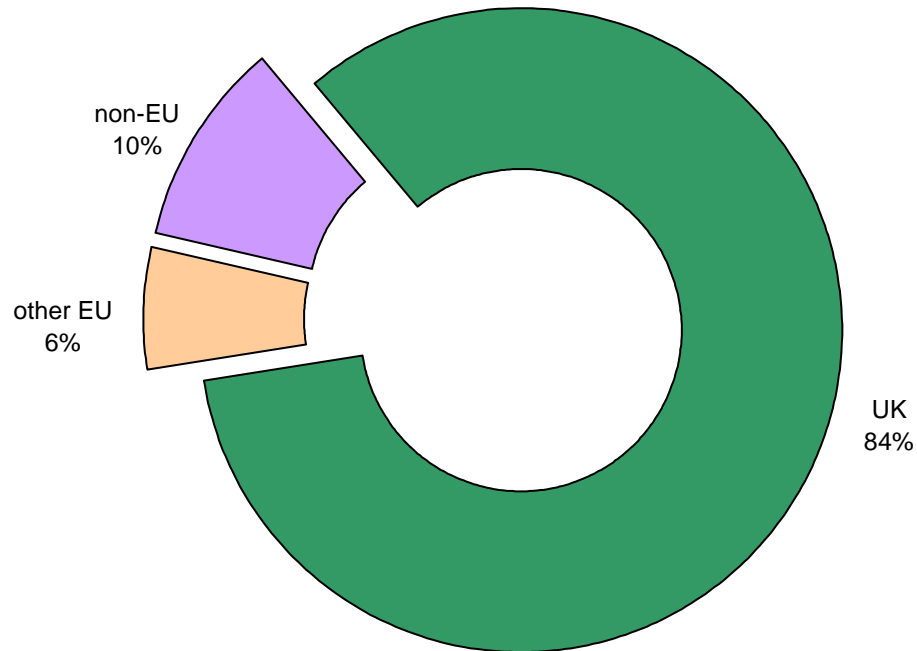
Study mode for HE students in London region (n = 388,000)



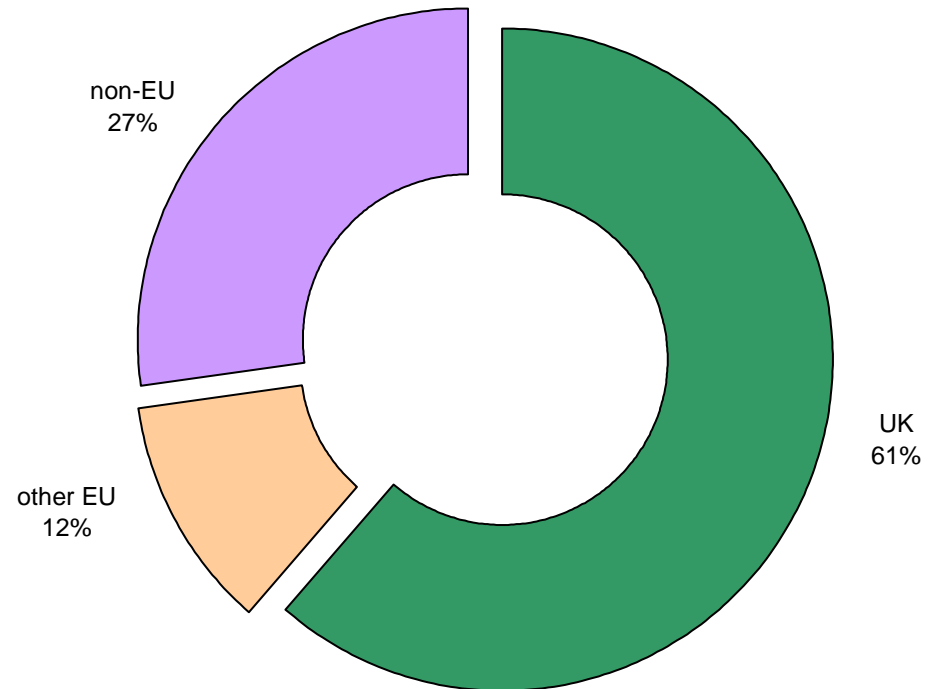

Undergraduate students (n = 277,165)

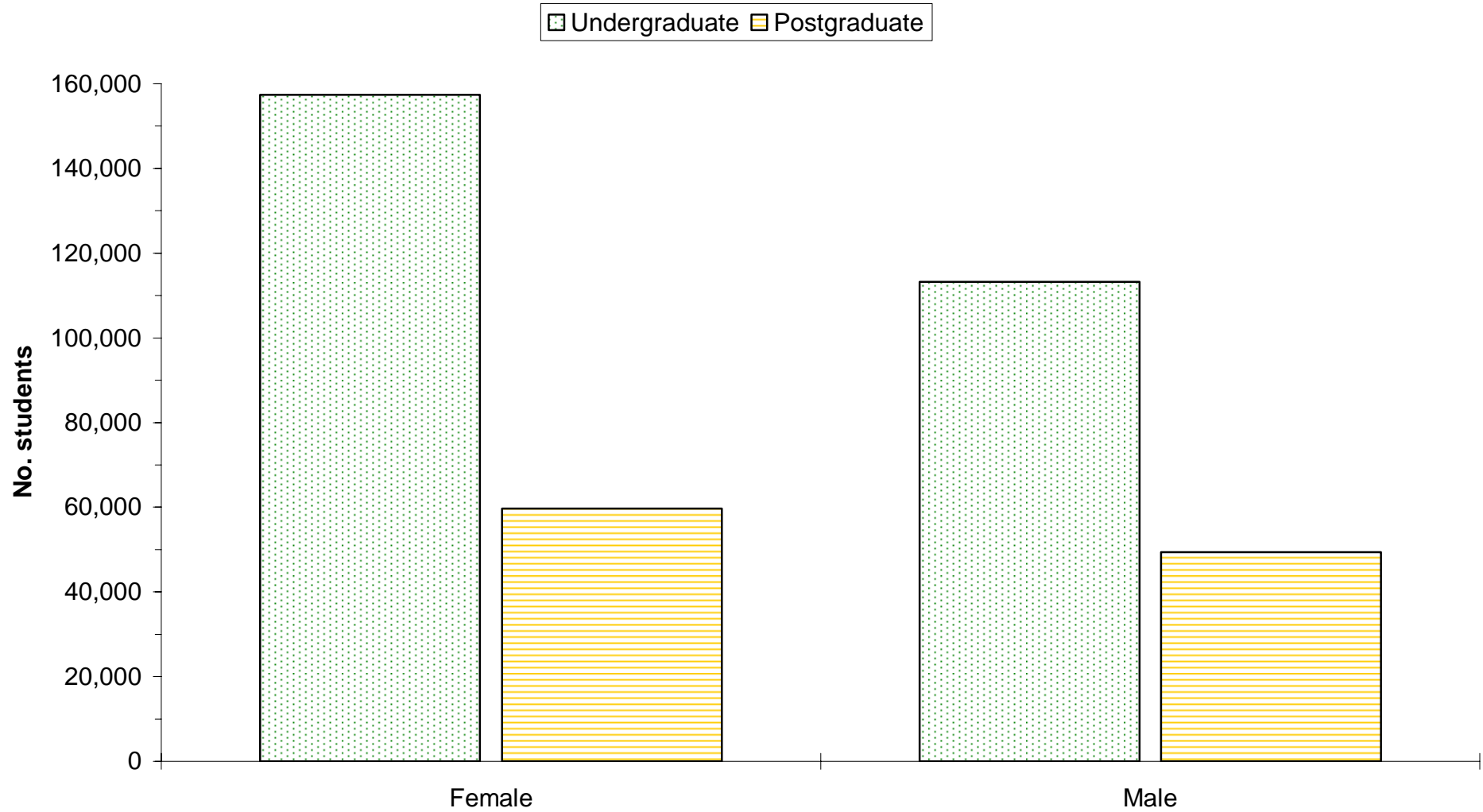


Postgraduate students (n = 110,920)



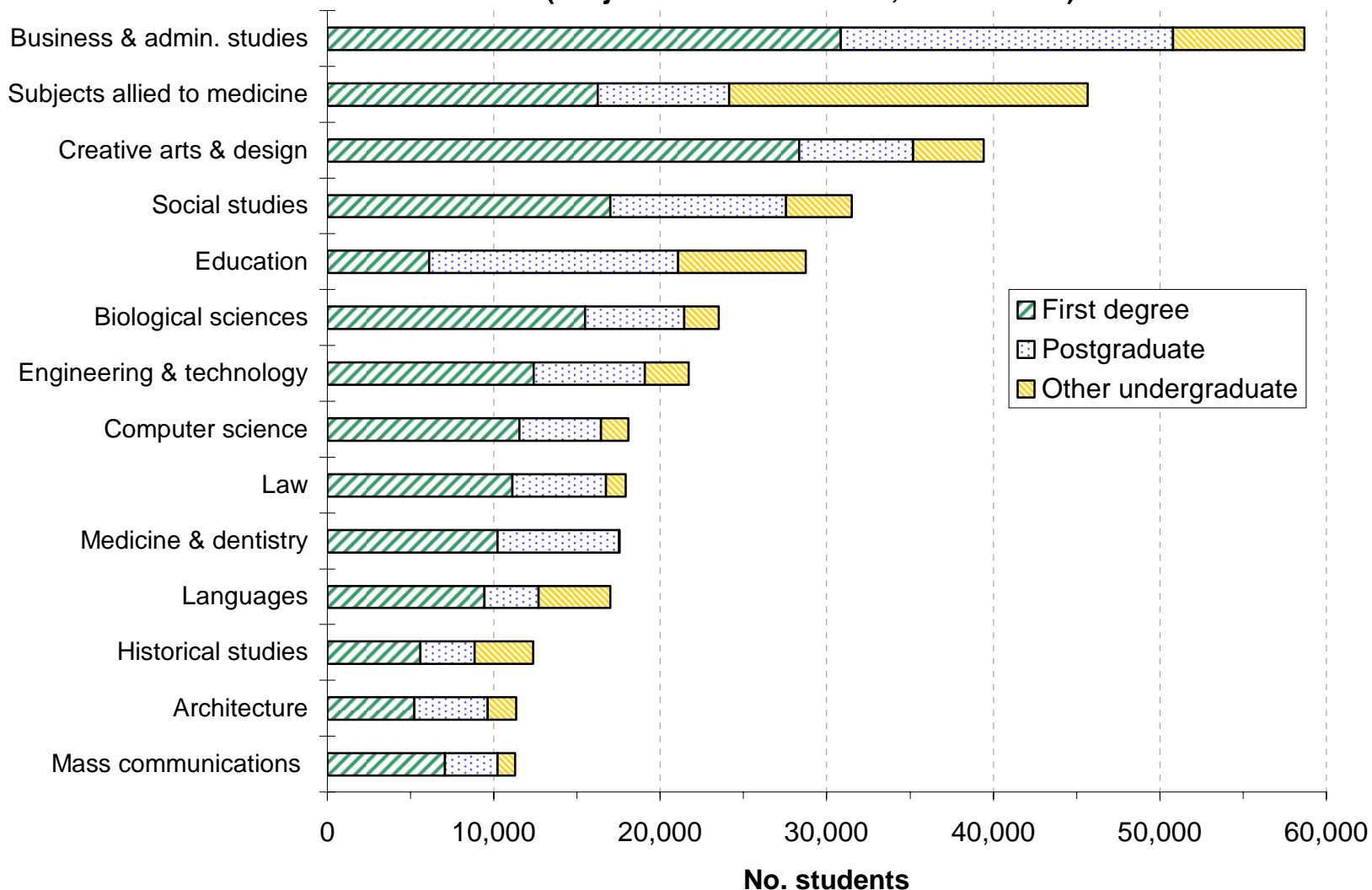

Gender of students in London region (n = 379,695)



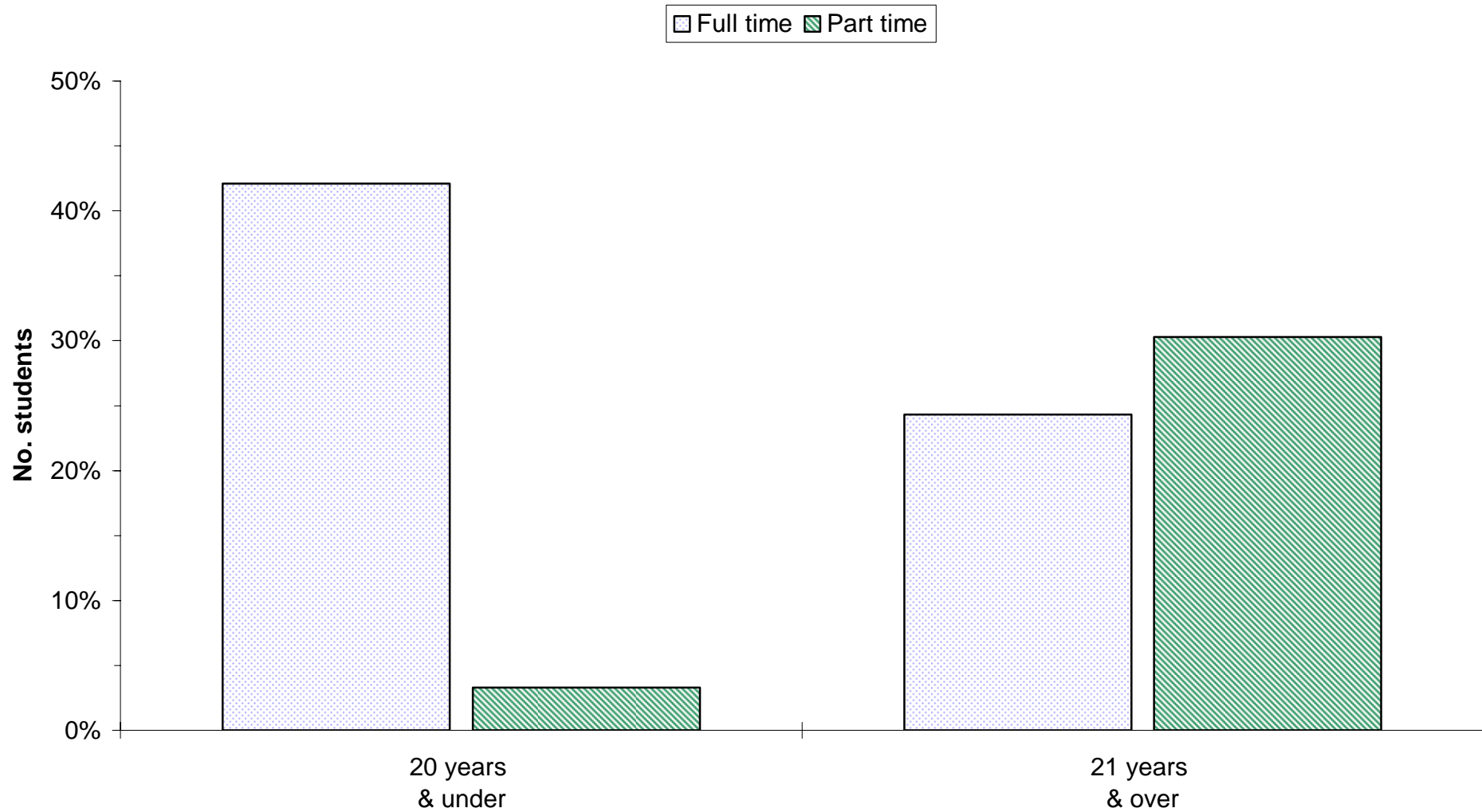

(subjects with more than 9,000 students)**



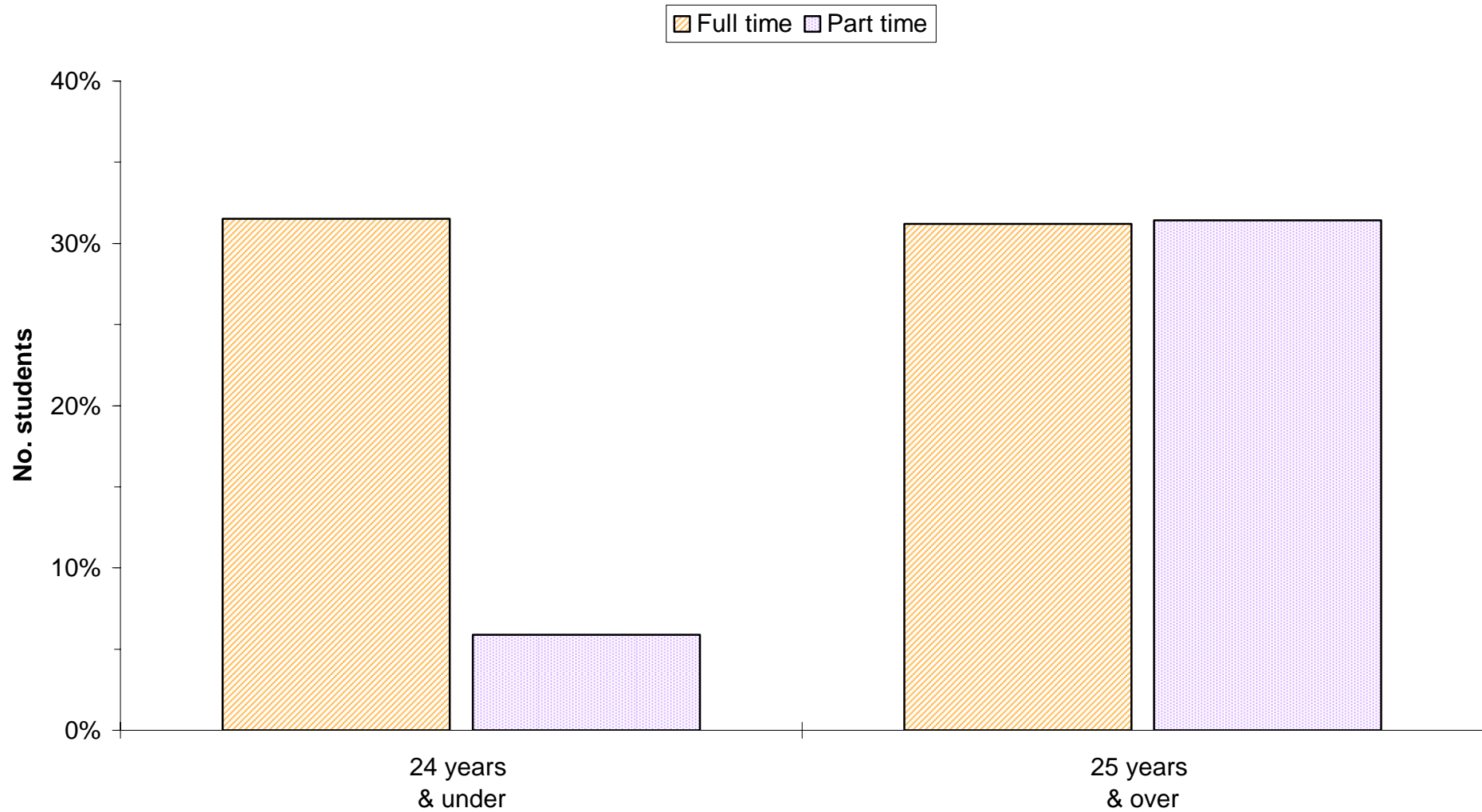

Age bands for first year undergraduates in London region (n = 118,925)



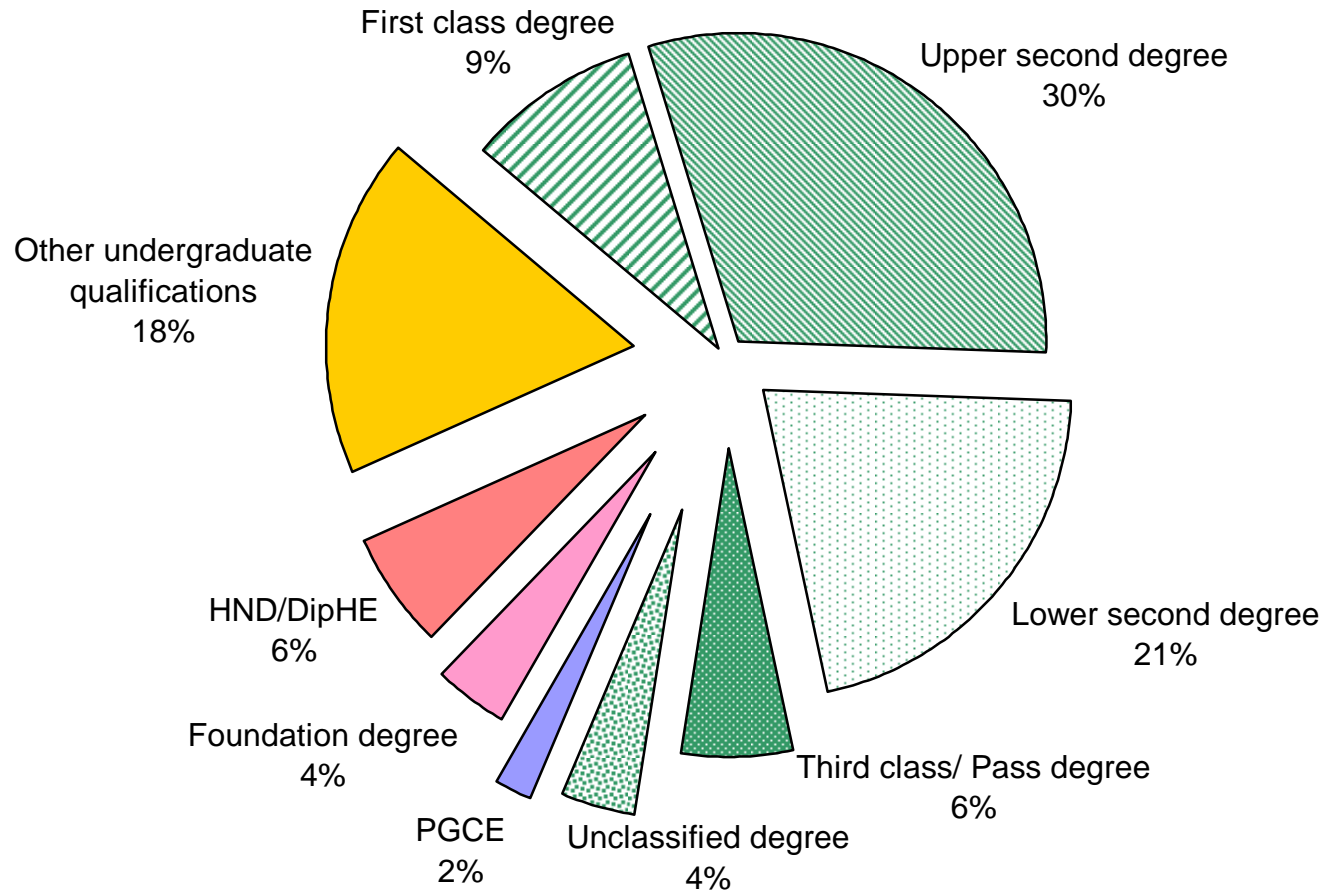
