

LONDON HIGHER FACTSHEET 2011



DESTINATIONS OF LEAVERS FROM HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS, 2009/10

- First destinations data are collected annually for UK and other EU graduates six months after completing their higher education (HE) studies;
- For the current survey 165 HE institutions in the UK provided information including 41 HE institutions in London and 34 outside England;
- Over 62,000 graduates from London HE institutions responded, comprising 16% of all 378,800 respondents in the UK;
- In London 64% of UK and other EU graduates were in work, 22% were carrying out further studies or combining work and further study, while 9% were assumed to be unemployed;
- These figures were similar to findings for all of the UK where 65% were in work, 24% in further studies or combining work and further study, and 7% thought to be unemployed;
- 97% of UK graduates from HE institutions in London who were working stayed within the UK;
- 71% of UK graduates who studied in London found employment in the capital, and a further 19% were working in the East of England or the South East.

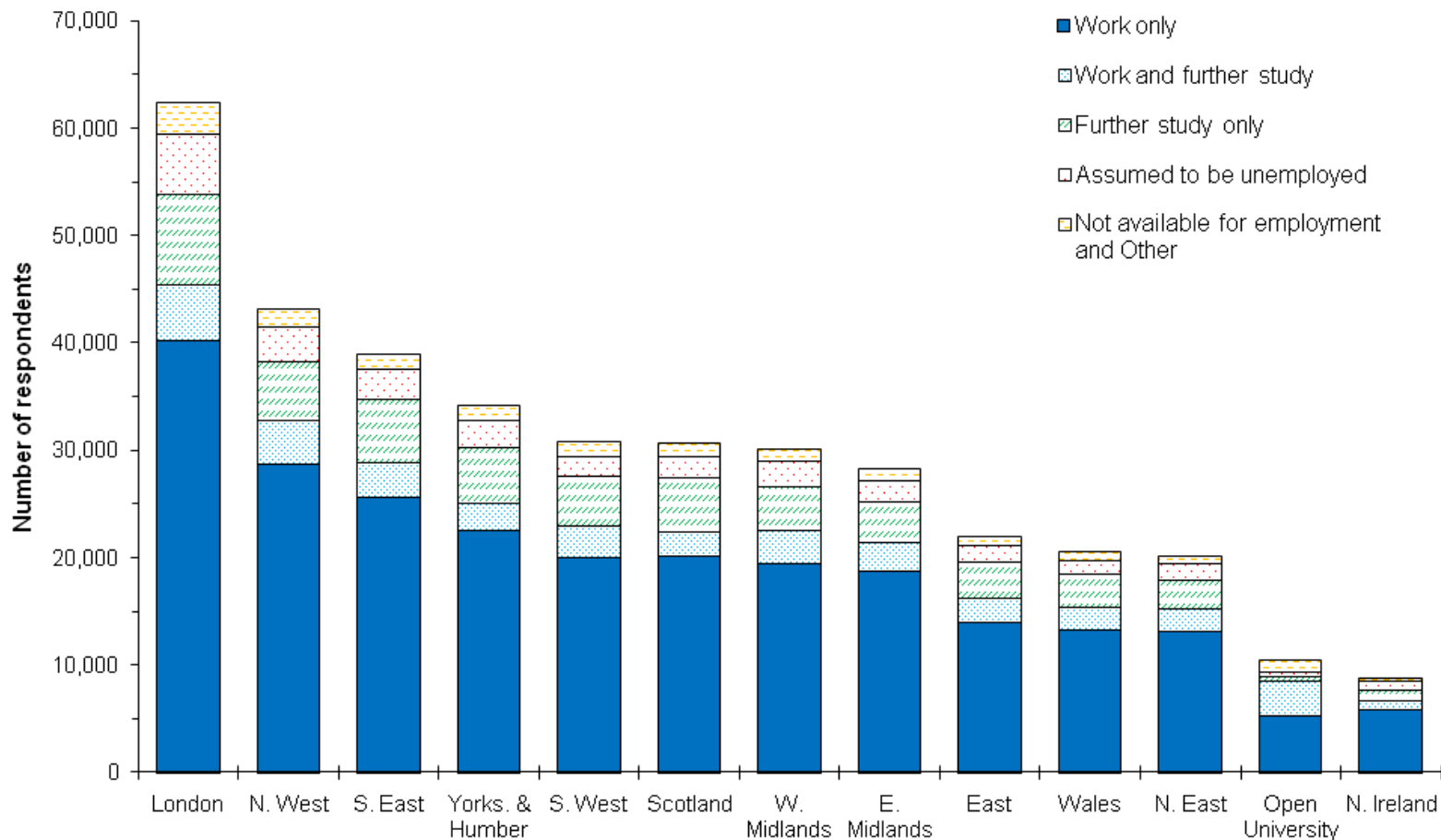
