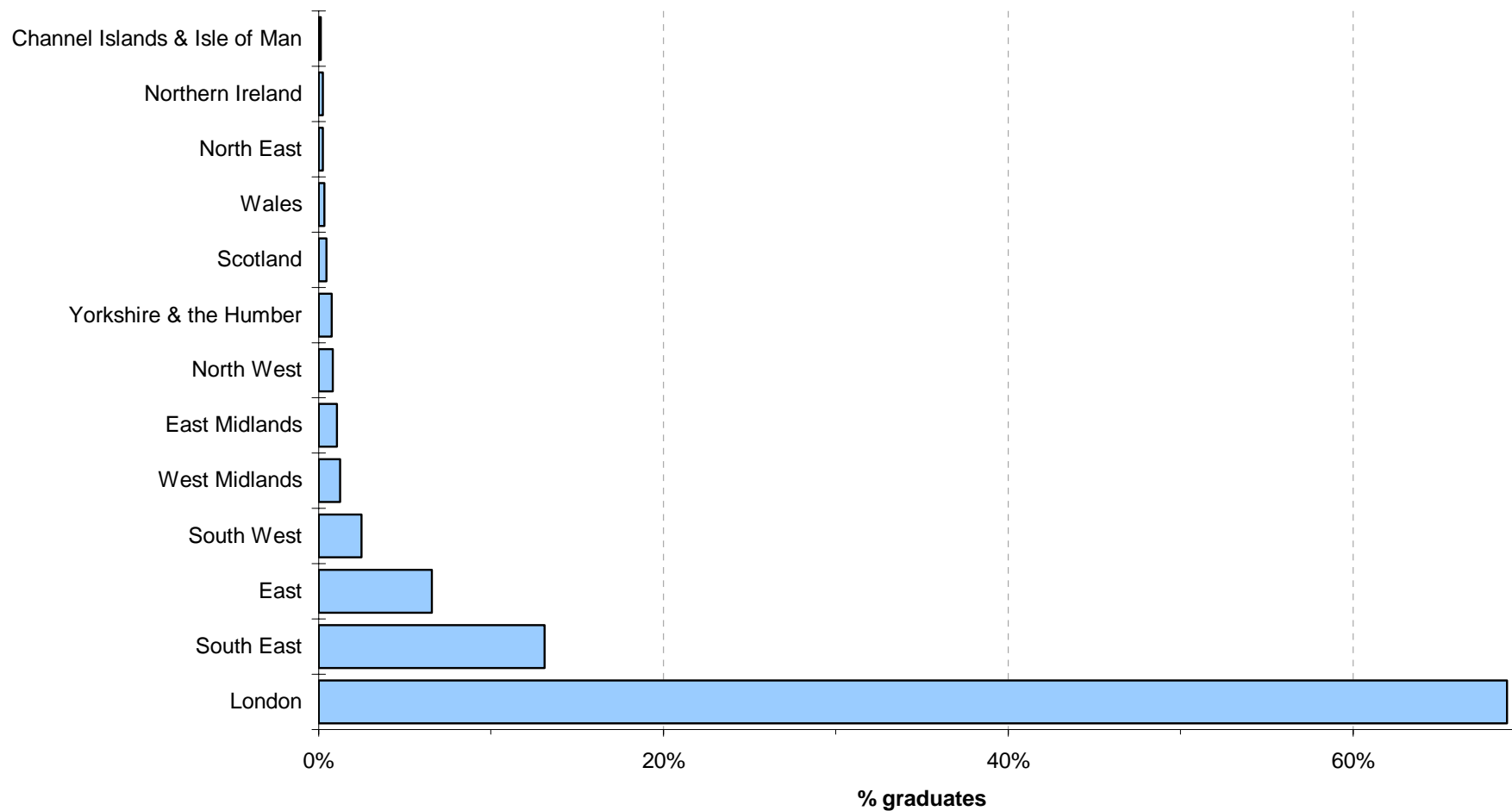


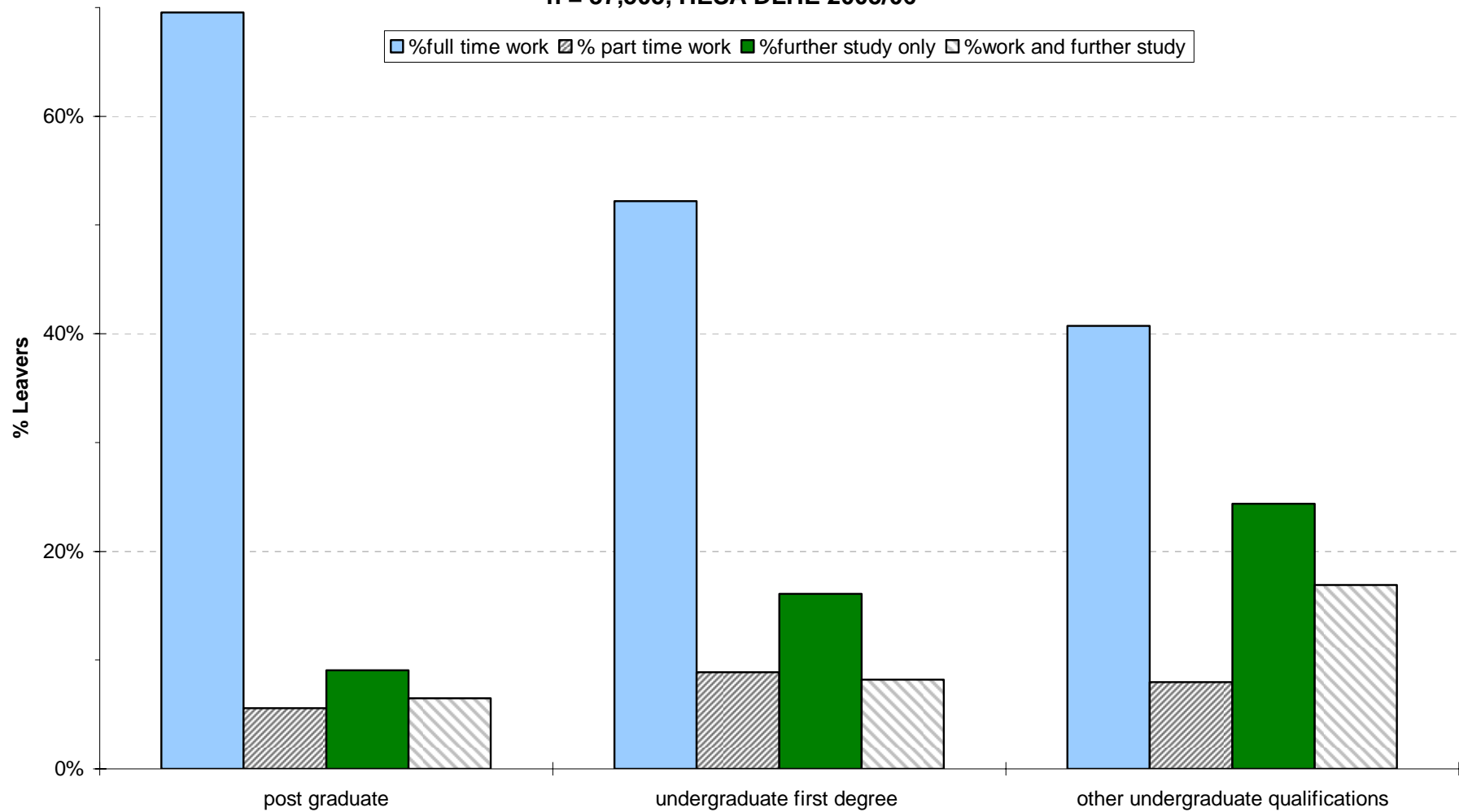
- Data is collected on destinations of graduates approximately six months after leaving a higher education (HE) institution
- Of 37,505 full time HE students who studied in London , 56% found full time work and about 15% went on for further studies
- From 12,790 part time postgraduate and undergraduate students, 62% obtained full time work and 5% registered for further studies
- 53% full time (n=27,790) and 62% part time (n=10,940) students obtained positions which were either permanent or with contracts  $\geq$  12 months
- Combining full time and part time students, 70% of post-graduates found employment, followed by 50% of undergraduates taking a first degree and 40% of undergraduates taking other courses
- 80% of leavers domiciled in London were also employed within London, which is the highest figure for all of the English regions
- Almost 70% of leavers who studied in London subsequently found employment in London,
- Nearly 90% of London graduates were employed in London, the South East or in the East of England
- Full time undergraduates were more likely to continue in full time education, if not employed, while part time students were more likely to combine work and study if taking further qualifications
