

Biotechnology and Biological Sciences Research Council: grant success rates for 2016/17

- Awards for research grants submitted during 2016/2017 have been summarised by region and research organisation (RO).
- Of 121 ROs applying for grants, 22 were in London and of these 13 received one or more awards.

- The overall success rate for ROs in London was similar to 2014/15 and 2015/16.
- ROs in London won almost 15% of the £214 million awarded by BBSRC in this period.
- Of the 85 grants in London, 25 were awarded to UCL, 15 to Imperial College London and 15 to King's College London.
