

## LONDON HIGHER FACTSHEET 2018

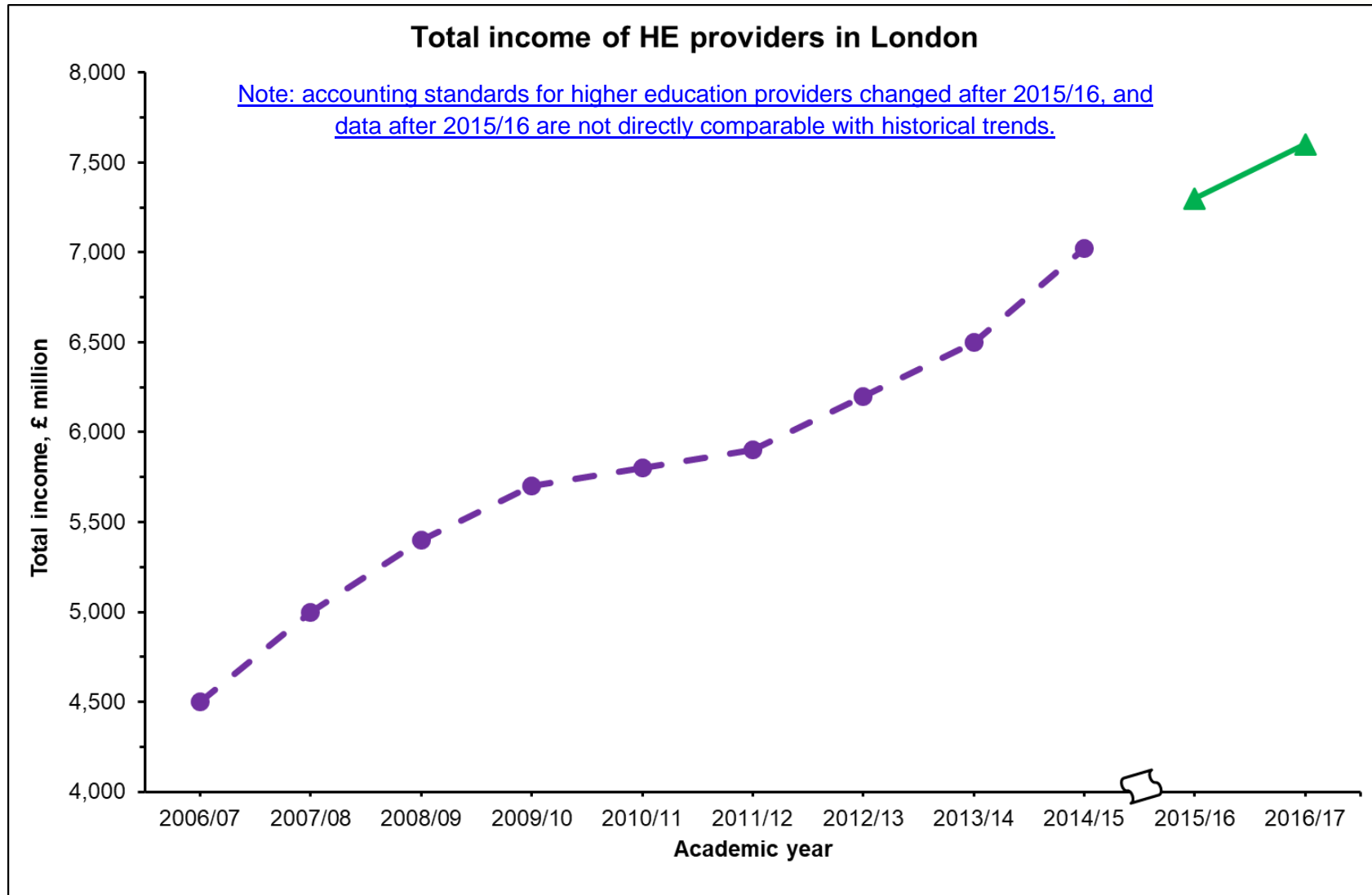
### FINANCES OF HE PROVIDERS IN LONDON 2016/17

1. During 2016/17, 164 UK higher education providers (HEPs) had a total income of £35,670 million and a total expenditure of £34,495 million.
2. The 40 HEPs in London had a combined income of £7,610 million and expenditure of £7,278 million.
3. Total income for HEPs in London was made up of (i) £3,713 million (48.8% of total) from tuition fees and education contracts; (ii) £1,476 million (19.4%) from research grants; (iii) £1,013 million (13.3%) from funding body grants; (iv) £455 million (6.0%) from residences, catering and conferences, and (v) £954 million (12.5%) from other sources including IP income and donations and endowments.
4. Income from tuition fees and education contracts was made up of:
  - a. £1,429 million (or 38.5% of total fees income) from UK-domiciled full time undergraduates
  - b. £1,275 million (or 34.3%) from non-EU postgraduate and undergraduate students
  - c. £335 million (or 9.0%) from Other EU domiciled postgraduate and undergraduate students
  - d. £229 million (or 6.2%) from UK-domiciled full time postgraduate students.
5. For research grants and contracts in London:
  - a. UK sources provided £1,084 million (73.4% of total research grants), including £417 million from UK Research Councils and academic societies; £308 million from UK-based charities; £210 million from central government, local authorities and health bodies, while industry sources provided £81 million
  - b. Nearly £236 million (16.0% of research total) came from EU sources with £174 million from EU government bodies
  - c. Non-EU sources provided £157 million (10.6% of research total) with £54 million from non-EU charitable organisations.
6. Grants from HEFCE were largely for research (£480 million or 47.4% of total) followed by teaching (£364 million or 36.0%).
7. Income from other sources included £36 million from intellectual property rights which was 13-fold less than income from residences and catering.
