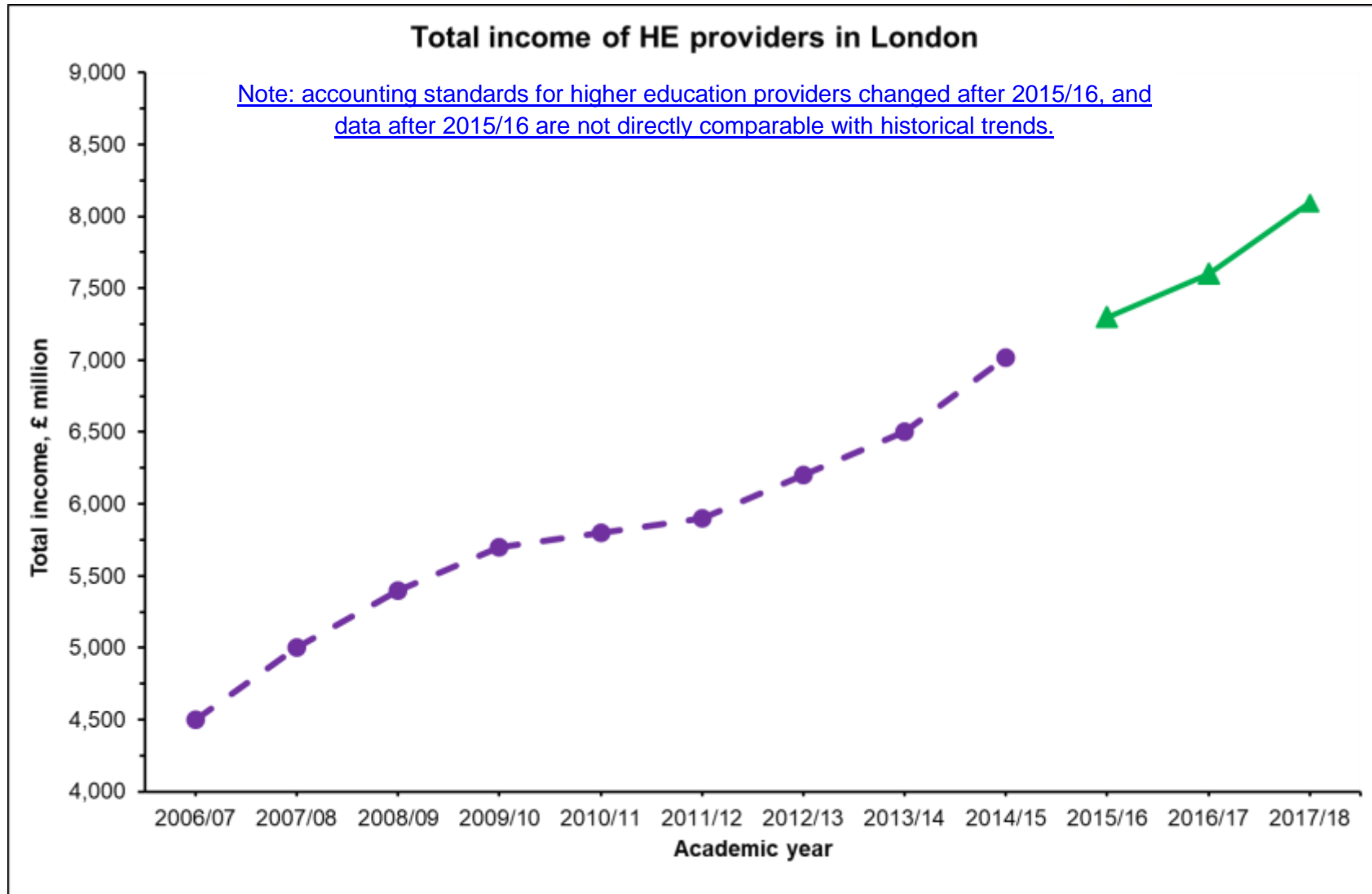
FINANCES OF HE PROVIDERS IN LONDON 2017/18

1. During 2017/18, 165 UK higher education providers (HEPs) had a total income of £38,250 million and a total expenditure of £37,220 million.
2. The 40 HEPs in London had a combined income of £8,093 million and expenditure of £7,682 million.
3. Total income for HEPs in London was made up of (i) £3,995 million (49% of total) from tuition fees and education contracts; (ii) £1,527 million (19%) from research grants; (iii) £1,055 million (13%) from funding body grants, and (iv) £1,198 million (15%) from other income.
4. Income from tuition fees and education contracts was comprised of:
 - a. £1,853 million (or 46% of total fees income) from UK-domiciled students
 - b. £1,433 million (or 36%) from non-EU students
 - c. £380 million (or 10%) from Other EU students.
5. For research grants and contracts in London:
 - a. UK sources provided £1,132 million (74% of total research grants), including £421 million from UK Research Councils and academic societies
 - b. EU sources provided £233 million (15% of research total) with £180 million from EU government bodies
 - c. Non-EU sources provided £161 million (11% of research total) with £54 million from non-EU charitable organisations.
6. Income from other sources included £39 million from intellectual property rights £479 million from residences, conferences and catering.
