

## Arts and Humanities Research Council: grant success rates for 2018/19

- This data provides the competitive funding decisions made by the Arts and Humanities Research Council (AHRC) between April 1 2018 and March 31 2019.
- Research organisations in London won 14% of the £99 million awarded by the AHRC.
- University of the Arts, London received the highest number of awards from the AHRC, 7, followed by King's College London with 6 awards and Goldsmiths College with 5 awards.
