

## Biotechnology and Biological Sciences Research Council: grant success rates for 2018/19

- This data provides the competitive funding decisions made by the Biotechnology and Biological Sciences Research Council (BBSRC) between April 1 2018 and March 31 2019.
- Research organisations in London won 16% of the £214 million awarded by the BBSRC.
- University College London received the highest number of awards from the BBSRC, 18, followed by Imperial College of Science, Technology and Medicine with 17 awards and King's College London with 15 awards.

Note: The figures published here are not comparable to previous years as the methodology has changed – for example, in the past some councils took the number of applications received in a year and reported the decision of these. Instead they now look at the decisions made in a year, and what those decisions were, regardless of when the application was received.
