

Engineering and Physical Sciences Research Council: grant success rates for 2018/19

- This data provides the competitive funding decisions made by the Engineering and Physical Sciences Research Council (EPSRC) between April 1 2018 and March 31 2019.
- Research organisations in London won 23% of the £611 million awarded by the EPSRC.
- University College London received the highest number of awards from the EPSRC, 35, followed by the Imperial College of Science, Technology and Medicine with 28 awards and Queen Mary University of London with 12 awards.
