

Economic and Social Research Council: grant success rates for 2018/19

- This data provides the competitive funding decisions made by the Economic and Social Research Council (ESRC) between April 1 2018 and March 31 2019.
- Research organisations in London won 21% of the £195 million awarded by the ESRC.
- University College London received the highest number of awards from the ESRC, 24, followed by King's College London with 11 awards and London School of Economics and Political Science with 7 awards.
