

Natural Environment Research Council: grant success rates for 2018/19

- This data provides the competitive funding decisions made by the Natural Environment Research Council (NERC) between April 1 2018 and March 31 2019.
- Research organisations in London won 12% of the £152 million awarded by the NERC.
- Imperial College of Science, Technology and Medicine received the highest number of awards from the NERC, 19, followed by University College London with 9 awards and King's College London with 6 awards.
