

Science and Technology Facilities Council: grant success rates for 2018/19

- This data provides the competitive funding decisions made by the Science and Technology Facilities Council (STFC) between April 1 2018 and March 31 2019.
- Research organisations in London won 16% of the £101 million awarded by the STFC.
- Imperial College of Science, Technology and Medicine received the highest number of awards from the STFC, 15, followed by University College London with 7 awards and Queen Mary University/King's College London with 3 awards.
